

Strawberries and Bananas.-Slice six him and that he will regain his health. bananas in half lengthways, using a silver knife, and arrange them in the center of a glass dish to form a high, square, latticed basket. Pass half a pound of strawberry jam through a sieve, beat the whites of three eggs to a stiff froth and then beat in the strawberry pulp and the juice of half a lemon. If the color is not good add a few drops of cochineal. Fill the banana basket with the pink sponge, piling it roughly on top. Decorate the edge of the basket with glace cherries. using a little melted gelatin to make them stick. Whip some thick cream with a pinch of sugar and put a ring of it round the basket and serve.

Including Strawberries.

Strawberry and Pineapple Preserves. -Take three quarts of strawberries, hull and wash them. Remove the peel and eyes from two small pineapples. cut into half inch slices and then into cubes, removing the hard core. Put the fruit and four pounds of sugar in alternate layers in a granite preserving kettle and let stand closely covered over night. In the morning add the juice of one lemon and one orange. Cover the peel of the orange with cold water, beat it slowly to boiling, then drain. Scrape off the bitter white inner lining, cut into narrow strip with scienors and add to the other ingredients. Put the mixture over the fire, heat gradually to boiling, taking off the scum, and cook slowly until the pincapple is tender. Then finish cooking in the sun
