

ESSENCE OF RIGHT SPRAYING | sour. Mixture Must Be Slammed Into Tree With Force Enough to Penetrate

The very essence of right spraying slamming the material into the tree twigs, buds and leaves with force enough to make it penetrate into every quarter inch of surface. All the bark must be wet with the solution. It will not do to wet the top surface of the leaf and leave the other untouched. Both sides of the leaves must have their spray bath of the poisonous mist if the tree insects are to be routed satisfactorily.

Every Inch of Surface.

Missing a few clusters of leaves and twigs or failing to get to one limb in the top or in the center of a tree, will leave a colony of the tree enemies big enough to reinfect the whole tree in a very short while. It should be all or none, for anything less than a thorough spraying is a waste of both time and money and mighty discouraging to boot.

You have to know the enemies you are going out to kill. In other words, you have to know what to spray for, when to spray and how to spray.

Study all your tree enemies and get well enough acquainted with them that you know them when you see them and know about when to look for them. This thing of pulling out the sprayer and starting in "hit or miss" is not likely to be worth what it costs. Don't try to fight tree enemies unless you know what they are and when the spraying should be

There are some of these enemies that can be successfully attacked on but a few days in every year. You will have to learn to know them at sight and to know when these days come, if you are going to rid your orchard of the pests. You ought to be ready for the days when they come, ache has not returned in its severity, because there is little or no time to prepare after the pests make their appearance. Learn to know the spraying times and to be able to take full advantage of them, and when they come keep the sprayer going from son. dawn till dark. Remember, you can hardly ever kill the old or the adult bugs with a spraying mixture anyway, and that you must strike the young ones to make any progress.

# SECURE A SUITABLE SPRAYER

Any Owner of Fruit Trees Can Pur chase Pump Adapted to Needs-Main Thing Is Force.

There are hundreds of different sprayers and spraying pump types on the market. Any man from the one who owns half a dozen fruit trees in his back yard to the owner of a thousand acres of bearing trees can find a sprayer suited to his needs. The main thing is to get one that will throw the liquid with force enough to drive it into the crevices of the bark and the openings between the leaves. If you need more hose rods, towers and more powerful pumps in order to do this, why, then, it will pay you to get them.

And there is another thing. No man pretends to know all there is about spraying. Every year some new discovery is made. Some of these just about revolutionize spraying as to certain insects or certain trees. The best method in 1914 may be out of date by the spring of 1915. The only thing to do is to keep informed by reading and by Reeping in touch with the experiment station in your state. Every little while some fellow brings out a shorter and better way of spraying that saves a lot of time and money. You want to keep up with these if you can, for the whole science of insect fighting is changing fast.

The chemical companies that make spraying compounds can help you keep in touch. So can the United States department of agriculture and your state agricultural authorities.

Avoid Injury by Rodents. To prevent injury by mice or rab-

bits, apply in the fall of the year a wash made of one gallon of lime-sulphur solution to eight gallons of water, put on with a spray or brush This same solution, if applied to the trunks of trees in May, will also help to keep out the borers, or at least keep the beetles from laying their
