

Feeding Green Corn is Bad Practice-Always Have Grit and Charcoal Near Feed Troughs.

SOME GOOD POULTRY FACTS

Early Hatched Pullets Produce Eggs in Fall and Early Winter-Best Time for Hatching.

Pullets must be well matured before they will lay many eggs. Pullets that start to lay in the fall

before cold weather sets in will, as a rule, lay all winter. It is the early hatched pullets that

produce eggs in the fall and early winter, when prices are high.

February, March and April are the months to do your hatching in order to secure early hatched pullets.

Yearling and two-year-old hens do not lay many eggs in the fall, as they are molting at that time, and the lay, feed they consume goes not only to keep up the energy and life of the birds but also to put on or grow a new cost of feathers.

In properly matured pullets all surplus energy beyond that needed to meet the requirements of the body is going to the birds that crow oftenes available for the production of eggs.

BIG ADVANTAGE IN POULTRY

Soon After Hatching There Are Many Cockerels Ready for Market and Pullets Begin to Lay.

One of the advantages in poultry production is that returns come quickly. With the exception of strawberries, there is practically no line of small fruit on which you can begin to realize inside of three years. A milch cow does not approach her full power of production short of three years; apple trees do not begin to bear freely short of seven or eight years. How is it with hens? Three weeks from the setting of a hen you have a batch of chickens; four or five months after hatching you have a lot of cockerels for market and in from five to five and one-half months the pullets begin to

DUST VS. SPRAY FOR PESTS

Results of Experiments Comparing Lime-Sulphur With Dust in Several Commercial Orchards.

At the January meeting of western New York horticultural society Dr. Donald Reddick of the state college reported progress on the experiments comparing lime-sulphur with dust conducted in several commercial orchards in the Lake Ontario section.

He emphasized the work thus: 1. The experiment shows most strikingly that the mixture must be applied at the proper time.

2. The dust method is applicable to old and large trees which need it most.

3. Three to six times as many trees may be covered in a given time with dust as with spray.

4. The total cost of treating trees with any materials is not greater than for spraying them.

5. A mixture containing 10 per cent

lead arsenate is apparently sufficient to control common insects that chew. 6. Two to three pounds of dust mixture should be applied to each tree each time (in the experiments three

applications were made). 7. The experiments indicate so far that the dusting mixture should contain 90 per cent exceedingly finely ground sulphur and 10 per cent lead



PRUNING FOR APPLE TREES

Of Utmost Importance That Attention Be Given Annually-All Stumps Will Die Back.

It is of the utmost importance that apple trees should receive annual pruning, for otherwise long shoots four, five and six feet in length may be thrown out. The fruit is ultimately borne away out on these long branches which bend under the great weight and ofttimes break. Trees suffering from this-lack of pruning are very noticeable every fall when many overladen and improperly formed trees are badly broken. Such trees are bound to prove a great disappointment sooner or later. In cutting off branches no stumps should be left. They are the cause of many sore and rotten places on trees and will set up black heart in course of time. All stumps will die back to the main branch or body unless sprouts are allowed to grow on them to maintain vital action and this should not be allowed. Painting the wounds at once is quite helpful in preventing checking, decay and disease.

PRUNING YOUNG PEACH TREE

Should Be Cut Back About One-Half of Previous Year's Growth-Admit Sunlight.

Young peach trees should be cut back to the extent of about one-half the previous season's growth, and the limbs thinned so as to admit sunlight for ripening fruit. Old and bearing peach trees, that have had very little terminal growth, will need very little if any, heading back. All that will be necessary in this case is to cut out dead and broken limbs and possibly thin some clusters of fimb growth, if they were neglected in the early growth of the tree.




