SURPLUS FEED MAKES EGGS

Hens Requires Balanced Ration to Be Well Fed—Winter Layer Brings the Profits. Farmers do not realize that their flocks of hens should be as carefully fed and cared for as any other stock on their place. Most farm flocks are allowed to rustle for most of their living, and if they do not get it, they suffer.
