

Ninth Legislature of Illinois.

LEGISLATORS TO RECONVENE

Members of the Upper and Lower Branches on Wednesday, June 30, to Consider Action of Governor on Bills.

Springfield.-The Forty-ninth general assembly has concluded its work save the return trip to receive any vetoes or other messages from the governor's office.

On June 30 the members again will meet in their places, and if they find some of the measures passed have been vetoed by the governor they will have the opportunity to exercise the constitutional power of passing such measures by two-thirds vote of each house, in which event they will become_laws despite the veto.


