However, Prolonged Discussions French at Congress of Berlin Strained His Faculties.

Although a remarkably fine linguist, Blamarck found that the prolonged discussions in French at the congress of Berlin were a strain on his faculties. Shortly after the congress closed he told a friend that, "apart from the importance of the negotiations, it proved extremely exhausting to express myself in a foreign language so correctly that my observations could be embodied in the protocol without having to be altered. Before I proceeded to the congress I used to drink two or three beer glasses full of the strongest port wine, in order to get my blood to circulate properly. But for this stimulant I should have been quite unable to preside."

Blamarck's English was noted by Lord Randolph Churchill, who met the great Prussian at Kissingen in 1893. Lord Randolph describes him "speaking English very carefully and slowly, frequently pausing to get the right word, but always producing it or something like it in the end." One word that puzzled him was supplied by Lord Randolph. The talk had turned on Gladstone, who, Bismarck said, "had always been like an ungovernable horse, whom no one could ride in any bridle and was not to be controlled in any way." He used some German adjective to describe the horse (Lord Randolph forgot it) and asked what was the English equiva lent. Lord Randolph suggested "rogue," and he "turned his face to me with a smile, but said nothing, though he clearly understood the allusion."-London Chronicle.
