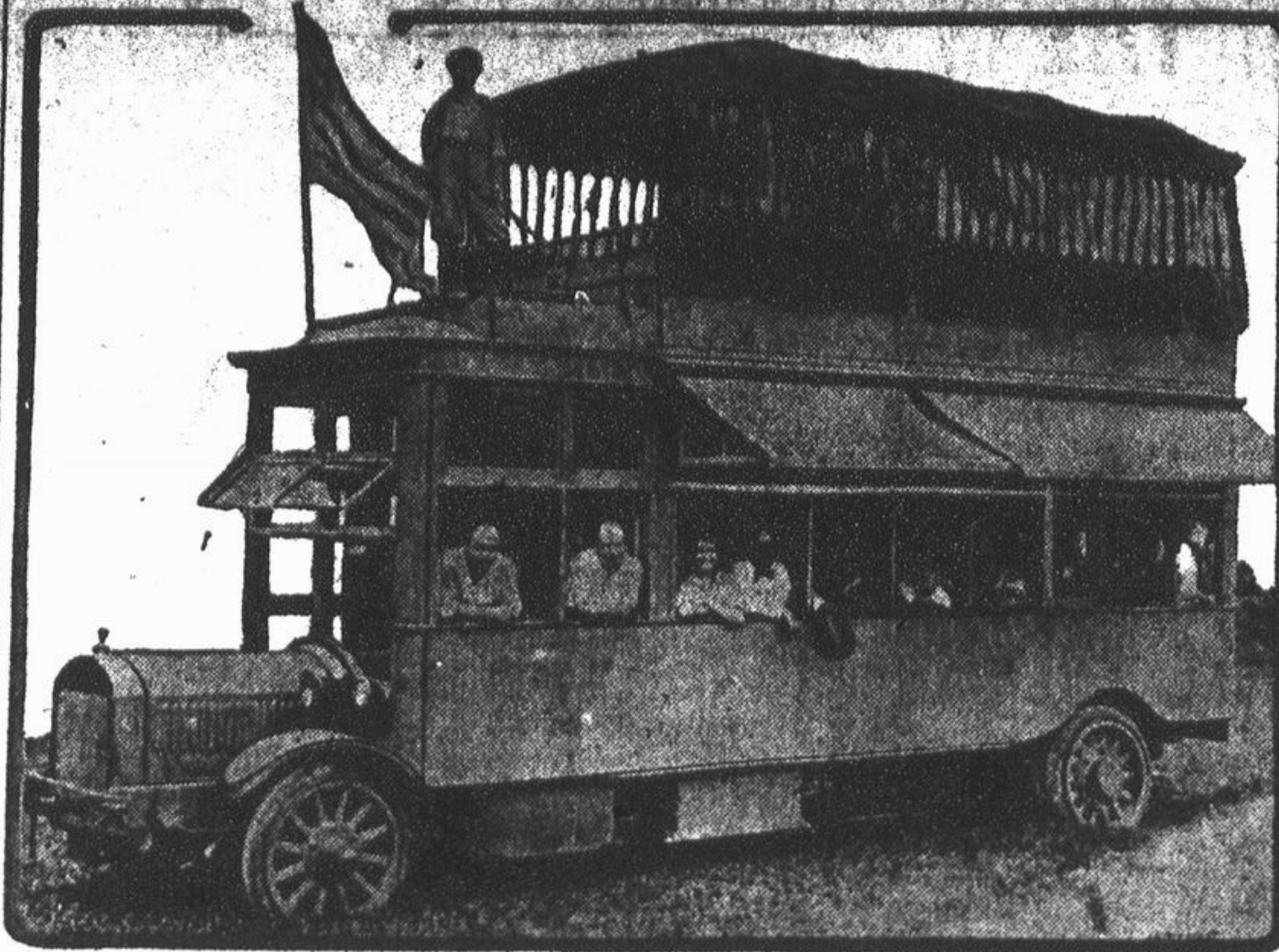
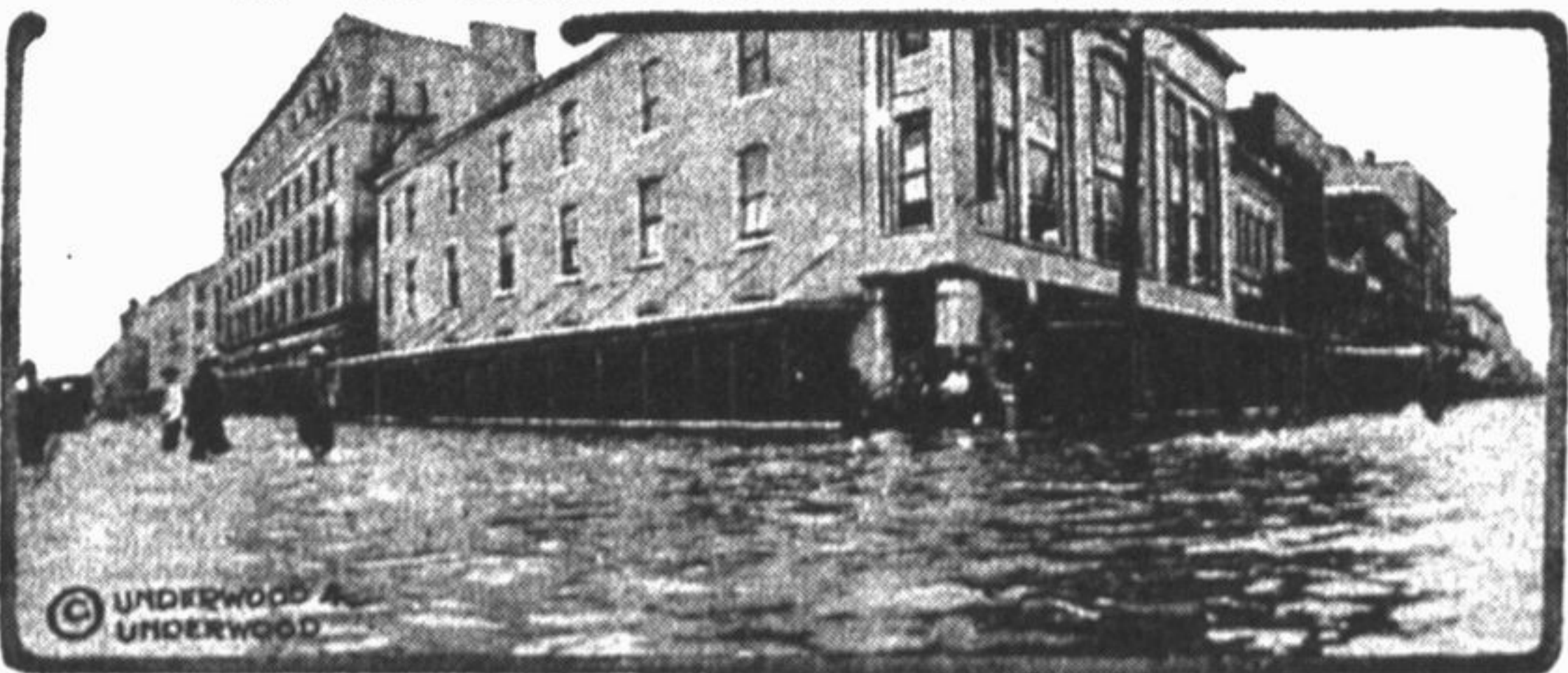


## LAND YACHT STARTS TO CROSS THE CONTINENT

## ZEBRA BORN IN CAPTIVITY



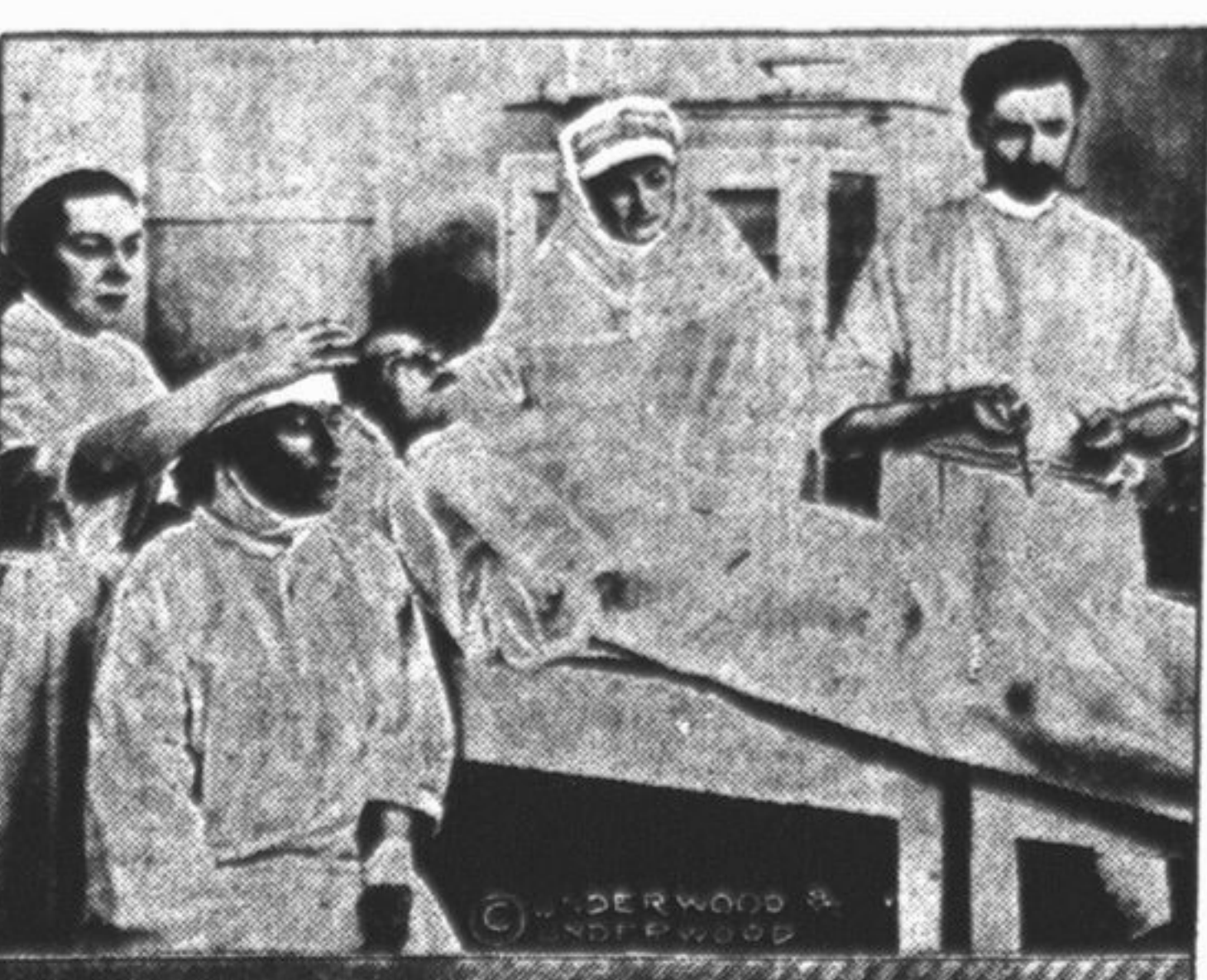
This baby zebra, believed to be the first one born in captivity in America if not in the world, is in the Central Park zoo, New York city, and is a finely marked and lively specimen.

## MAKING GREAT CANOE TRIP

Two New Jersey Sportmen Are Trying to Cross Continent by Rivers and Canals.

To determine the practicability of a transcontinental voyage by canoe, two New Jersey sportmen are headed, in their frail craft, for the Pacific coast. The route takes the couple through various rivers, lakes and canals to the headwaters of the Columbia river.

Missouri, thence the North Platte, through which they paddle to the Yellowstone and the Snake rivers. Intervening streams will carry them then to the Columbia.
