Food supplies the very sinew of war, therefore, the guarding of meat, milk, vegetables and grain becomes one of our imperative measures of defense. These essentials will have to be ooked after to supply those active at the front and those guarding the great

They do not today, as much as in former times, make their daily occupations their play. For this reason they flock to the centers of population to be

ill afford at such a time as this. With these conditions staring us in the face, our attention is turned to a serious condition which threatens a nation that may be long engaged in active warfare. ### Wonders of a Mirage,
