NEW TRAINING CAMPS FOR RESERVE OFFICERS.

Continued from page 1. Immediate Response Necessary... Applications for the second training camp will be received between June 15th and July 15th at the local officers' recruiting headquarters. Under no circumstances will an applicant be considered after July 15th. Upon the termination of this period, army examiners will visit various points, to be announced in each state. An applicant selected for personal and physical examination will be notified to appear before the regular army officer in person, at a convenient point, for inquiry into his record, capacity, leadership, and qualifications in general. The obligation involved is "enlistment for a period of three months only. Applicants will agree to accept, at the end of the training, such commission in the Army of the United States as may be tendered by the Secretary of War. The enlistment, however, obligates one to service in the training camp only. Sixteen Camps. The training camps are to be held in the South. The war department announces location for Illinois men at Leon Springs, Texas. (2 camps). For Divisional Area XI (Illinois).
