OPERATING COMMITTEE ON THE WAR PROBLEM WITH TUBERCULOSIS

Beginning of Most Important
War-Time Health Movement
in Any State

Tuberculosis Association and was recently appointed by Governor Lowden as Assistant Director of the State Department of Health. The names of members to carry out this important patriotic service in each county will be announced this week and the list will include many of the most prominent men and women in the State.

Tuberculosis has become the most serious medical war problem facing the warring nations of Europe. France is said to be staggering under the burden of half a million of her citizens incapacitated by wounds and another half million incapacitated by tuberculosis and another half million in the hands of the enemy.

Another tremendous job which is now well under way, is that of making a census of previous tuberculosis or marked exposure to the disease of all male citizens of military age. These records will be placed in the hands of recruiting officers as a means of keeping tuberculous persons out of military service.

The Council of Defense Committee members in each county will create a sub-committee to carry out the work in his own community.

To Keep Water Cold.
An excellent way to keep water cold a long time with little ice is to take a pitcher of ice and water and set in the center of a newspaper; then, by gathering the four corners at the top and bringing the ends together with a strong rubber band around them to hold close together, the air is excluded. A pitcher of water treated in this manner will stand all through the night with very little perceptible melting of the ice, and even after the ice
