The remedy can be made even more effective by adding a few drops of essence of peppermint to the hot water and soda. This makes a very powerful "soda mint tablet" indeed. If the indigestion is accompanied by slight nausea, aromatic spirits of ammonia often gives relief. Put half a teaspoonful in a third of a glass of water. This can be repeated at the end of half an hour if necessary. Sometimes the dose is more efficacious if given in half a cupful of hot water, instead of the smaller amount of cold.—Exchange.
