Tramp Proves to be Draft Dodger - Taken to Chicago by Federal Agents for Trial.

Dinger, together with a number of other vagrants, were let into the city jail to spend the night on Tuesday of last week. When the marshal let them out in the morning he questioned Dinger, who seemed to be the only one within the draft age, regarding his registration. He first said he was 21 years old and that he was born May 17, 1887. A little rapid mental arithmetic convinced Riehm that there was a discrepancy and he held him and notified the Department of Justice.

Monday afternoon at about 4:15 Loren W. Myers was on his way to Barbers Corners. As he turned a corner near the Leach farm, 6 miles south of Naperville, in Will county, he noticed a tractor in a stubble field with the engine running but apparently no one near it.

As he paralleled the tractor, which was about a rod from the fence, he saw the body of a man lying on the ground under the fly-wheel. Investigation revealed a terribly mangled body from which every vestige of clothing save the shoes, had been torn.

Mr. Myers hurried to the nearest farm house and told of his discovery, and it proved to be the home of the injured man, Mr. Ralph W. DeMeritt. The son, Harry DeMeritt, who operates the farm, was there and Dr. W. J. Truitt of Naperville was notified, and upon his arrival the injured man was taken to the home. Here it was found that the injuries were so severe that no hope of saving life could be entertained. Later the family physician, Dr. Ryder of Plainfield, arrived, and the two physicians did everything possible but death claimed the victim of the accident shortly after eight o'clock.
