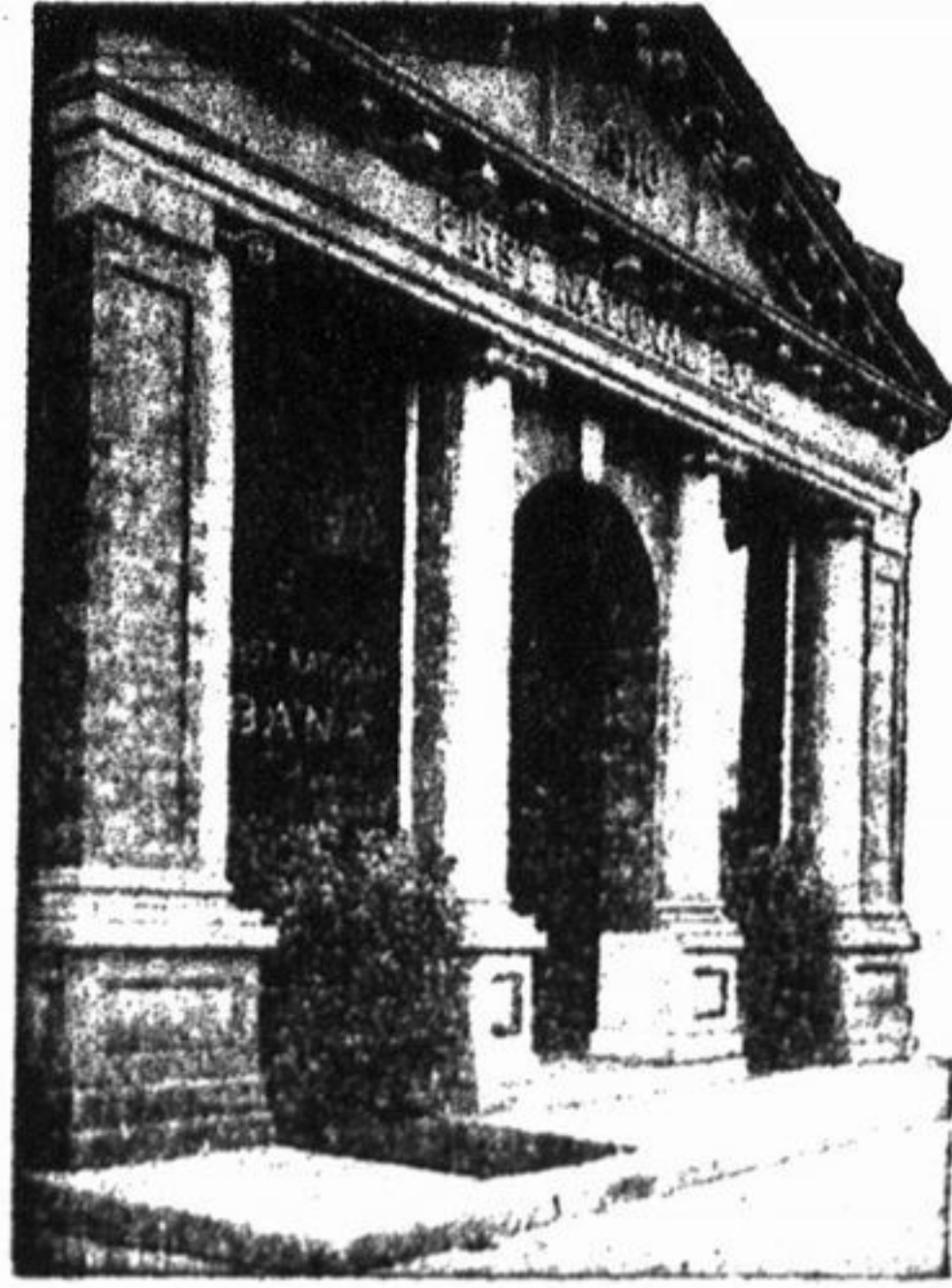

County Wide Meeting to be Held Early in January To Discuss Project

A few days ago representative men from each of the larger communities of DuPage met for a conference to consider the best means of promoting and directing a strong character building program for the 3,000 and more boys of DuPage County.

The County Work of the Young Men's Christian Association was agreed upon as the best approach to this opportunity. With the County, as a unit the County Work Plan binds the group of workers in each community into an Association Brotherhood, combines the financial resources of each community into a common fund and unites the various Christian laymen of each community into an efficient Administrative committee called the County Committee.

The County Committee of ten or twelve representative Christian Men are given authority to raise a budget and employ a County Secretary who not only conducts a county wide program as able boys conferences, athletic meets, a county camp, banquets and all in cooperation with other organizations in the field, but organizes boys and young men locally with the direction of the County Committee.
