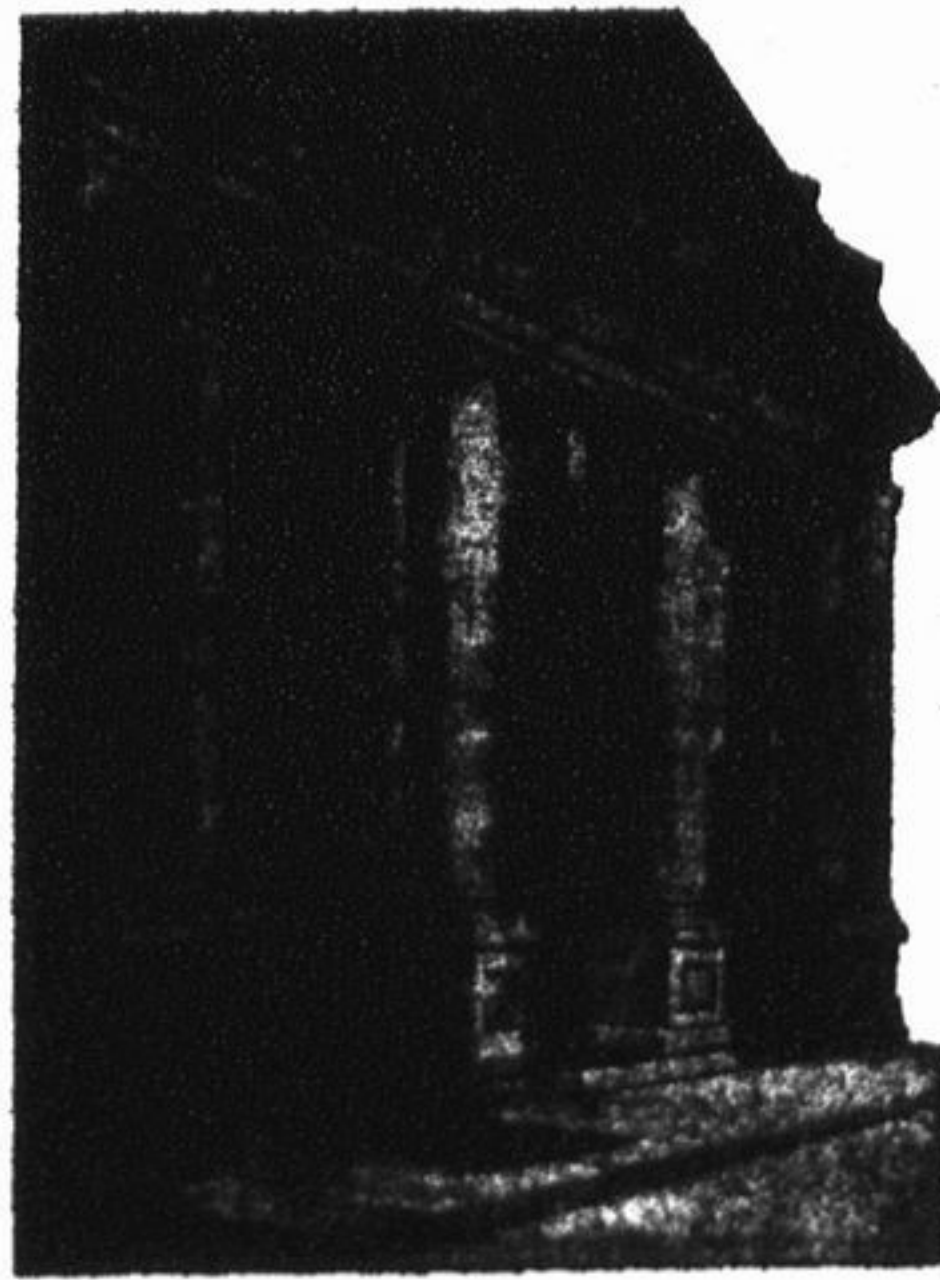

79 MORE DU PAGE COUNTY MEN NOW IN U. S. SERVICE

Fifty-four Leave Wheaton this Afternoon to Report at Jefferson Barracks, Missouri

Seventy-nine more Honor Men from DuPage County are now in the service of their country.

Twenty-five left Wheaton Monday morning for training at Camp Grant and fifty-four leave Wheaton this afternoon for Jefferson Barracks, Mo.

Those who have gone to Camp Grant are apparently designed for infantry regiments and will probably fill up gaps in the 342nd regiment in which most of the DuPage County men have been trained. Company C of this regiment, the one which local men were assigned to in the past, is just a skeleton of its former strength. Most of the privates have been transferred to fill up the gaps in the National Guard and Regular Army units and the non coms held to help train the new recruits.

Four Downers Grove men were in the draft which left Monday. Allan G. MacLean, John Zalipu, Chas. H. Wolf and Alban Johnson are the four. MacLean has had a great deal of training with the local I. R. M. unit and was a sergeant when leaving. He is well versed in infantry drill work, is a willing worker and should make his mark in the National Army.

The increment leaving Wheaton this afternoon for Jefferson Barracks, Mo. will leave at 6:35 for Chicago and will leave there at 9:00 o'clock.

Just what branch of the service they will enter is problematical. The local board for the county does not know and it is possible that they will be used in bringing up some regiment stationed at this post to war strength before going across.

Four local men are also included in this bunch. George Dieke, Herbert I. Stoudt, William A. Heal and William Olson are the four. Heal is a Company H regular and Stoudt is the first married man to be called from Downers Grove.

DU PAGE COUNTY OVER TOP WITH 3d LIBERTY LOAN

Reports From Every Section Show That Third Loan Was Handled in Right Way

DuPage County in the Third Liberty Loan has gone way over the top. Like everything that has been before the people since war was declared, this county is showing the state that it is loyal to the core.

Our quota, \$810,998, was passed in the first week of the drive and a conservative estimate places County subscriptions in excess of \$1,100,000.

Glen Ellyn was the first community in the County to report an oversubscription but all other towns and villages have followed suit. Downers Grove township with a minimum of \$180,000 has now about \$325,000 subscribed with hundreds of Burlington employees still to be heard from. This record beats anything so far reported from the county.

The only township not over to date is Winfield and they have promised that before the drive is over they will have reached the minimum.

That this loan was handled in the right way by every committee in the different towns is sure. The figures prove this. Almost every village and town in this district was solicited in the local fashion. A house to house canvass was made and reports turned in to the local committees on every resident. Very few of the blue or "slacker" cards were turned over to the Government from this section.

The Downers Grove village committee is very much gratified over the success of the loan here. Over \$100,000 is reported by the local banks and the loan flag has been flying since Monday. It was the push and stick-to-it-iveness of those in charge of the drive and the corps of workers that put the loan across here in the fine style it has gone. Mr. Curtiss and the members of his committee wish to thank Downers Grove people for their support and their treatment of the salesmen.

Following is a table from the Co. committee showing the quotas and totals of each district in the County. This was reported to the County Chairman Tuesday night so the totals are all low. A comparison can be seen in the west half of Downers Grove township, we are shown as having \$90,350 when the total is over \$100,000.

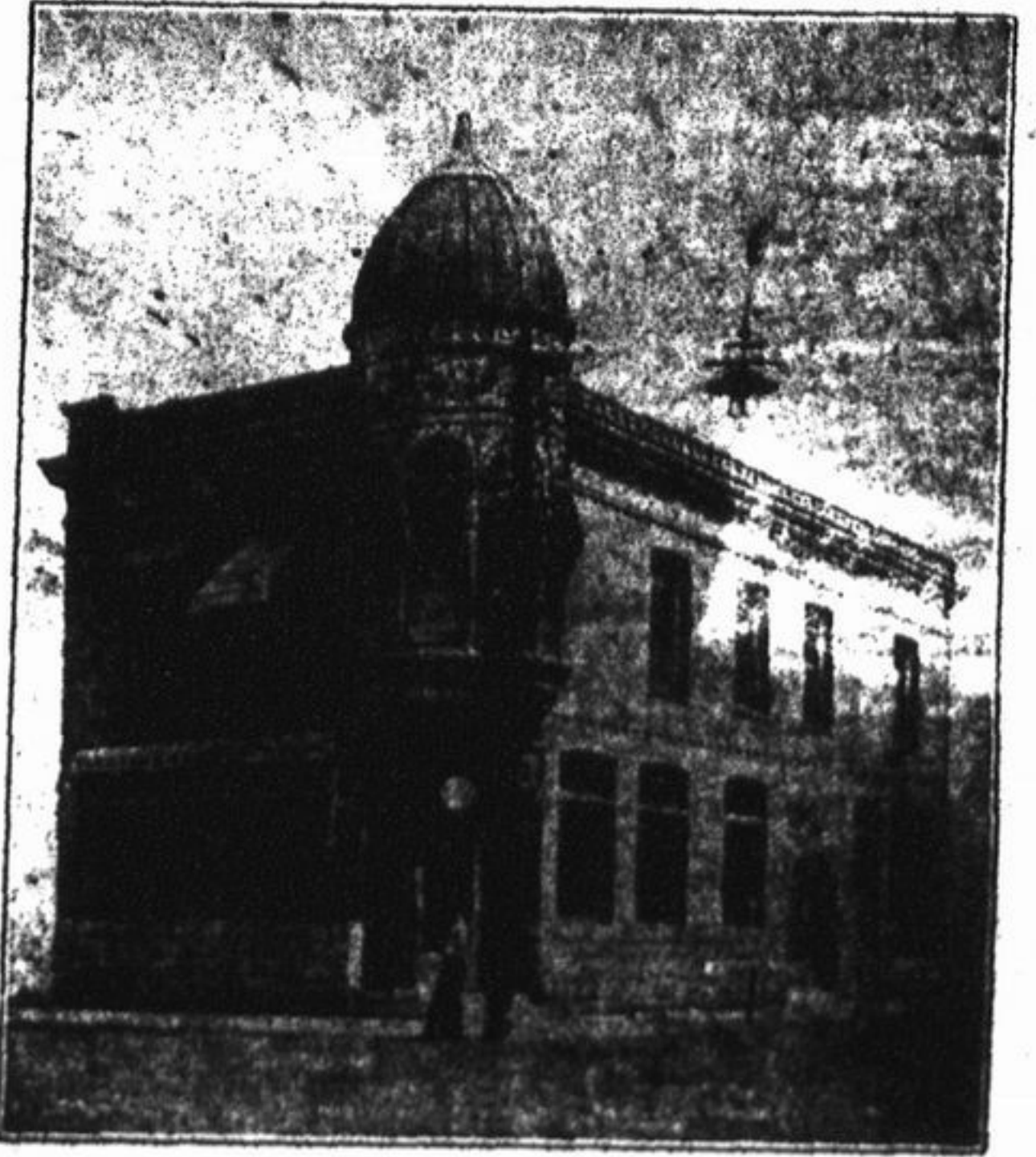
