TWENTY-TWO YEARS AGO IN THE REPORTER

(From the issue of May 28, 1896.)

A terrific wind storm struck this vicinity early Monday morning inflicting great damage to farmsteads near Cass. For a space of 200 feet wide and over two miles long the collapsed ruins of eight barns, numerous corn cribs and wind mills, and dozens of ruined orchards show where the wind dipped down to earth carrying everything in its path. On the farm of Escher Bros., occupied by Chas. Wenzel, the barn was unroofed. The next place visited by the storm was the Binder homestead where the orchard was entirely demolished, the plastering on the house damaged and the smokehouse carried into an adjoining field.
