Our reserve supply or carry-over from the 1917 crop is practically exhausted and is the smallest on record.

The need of building up reserves of wheat is evident. The increased planting asked of each State has been carefully determined with regard to its local conditions and its reasonable capabilities.

Let us sow liberally for a big harvest in 1919. It has been called the Liberty Wheat Harvest.

Illinois farmers are specifically called upon to increase last year's wheat acreage by at least thirteen per cent, and to increase it twenty-three per cent if possible.
