

This does not mean, however, that persons who now have labels should leave their packages until the last moment. Boxes should be mailed as soon as possible, to prevent last minute congestion which might delay the whole Christmas car-

In the case the nearest relative of a soldier does not receive the Christmas label before the final mailing date, application may be made to the Red Cross for authority to send the regulation package without it, Proof mus, be offered that the person making the application is the nearest relative, and a pledge must be signed that no other package has been or will be sent.


#### MRS. J. D. SMITH
