DAVID HAS RESIGNED AND IS HOME, Lieutenant Emerson David has resigned from the army and arrived home Tuesday evening from Camp Grant, where he has been stationed since the middle of September, He was attached to the 18th Co. 161st Depot Brigade where he was drilling rookies and getting them ready for service when the armistice was signed, Lieut. David was one of the men sent from the State University of Missouri to the S. A. T. C. at Fort Sheridan in the early part of June, He attended the first camp and was retained at the second as an instructor, He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant September 16th and immediately assigned to Camp Grant, He received his final discharge Tuesday, ALBERT SHERIDAN WOUNDED "OVER THERE", Albert Sheridan of Co. F, 7th U. S. Engineers wrote to his mother from Linoges, France on November 12th that he will soon be able to leave the hospital where he has been for two weeks and join his company, He said, "We were working near the front during a fierce battle on October 30th when a Hun shell exploded near us, killing two of the boys who were with me and wounding me in the left arm," While the wound is not a dangerous one it was very painful, but I am sure thankful that it is healed enough that I was able to be out and help the boys celebrate the signing of the armistice yesterday, and I can tell you it was some celebration, PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, Proceedings of the Board of Supervisors of DuPage County Ill. was, at a special meeting held at the Court House in Wheaton, on Friday the 29th day of November, A.
