GOVERNMENT PLANS VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR CRIPPLED SOLDIERS

It is intended by the government that there shall be no crippled soldiers selling pencils and shoe strings on the street corners after this war, and small necessity for "homes" where crippled men may be cared for.

The disabled man may elect the line of work he wants to take up. He may be re-trained for the work he did before the war, or turn to something entirely different.

The machinery through which this work of rehabilitation will be handled consists of a Federal Board of Vocational Re-education with branches in every principal city in the country.
