In justice to the hundreds of pupils of Downers Grove who have passed thru the schools and to the teachers who devote their time to the welfare of your children, we wish to render the following report on the past and present record of the Downers Grove High School as passed upon by the State University of Illinois also by the North-Central Association of Schools and Colleges.

Our high school has been fully accredited by the University of Illinois since 1910 and at present we have an advanced credit to 1922. The three year advanced credit is only given to schools of the highest efficiency. In the last year alone the high school credits have jumped from 18 to 23 1/2.
