WELCOME HOME BANQUETEVENING OF WED. JUNE 18

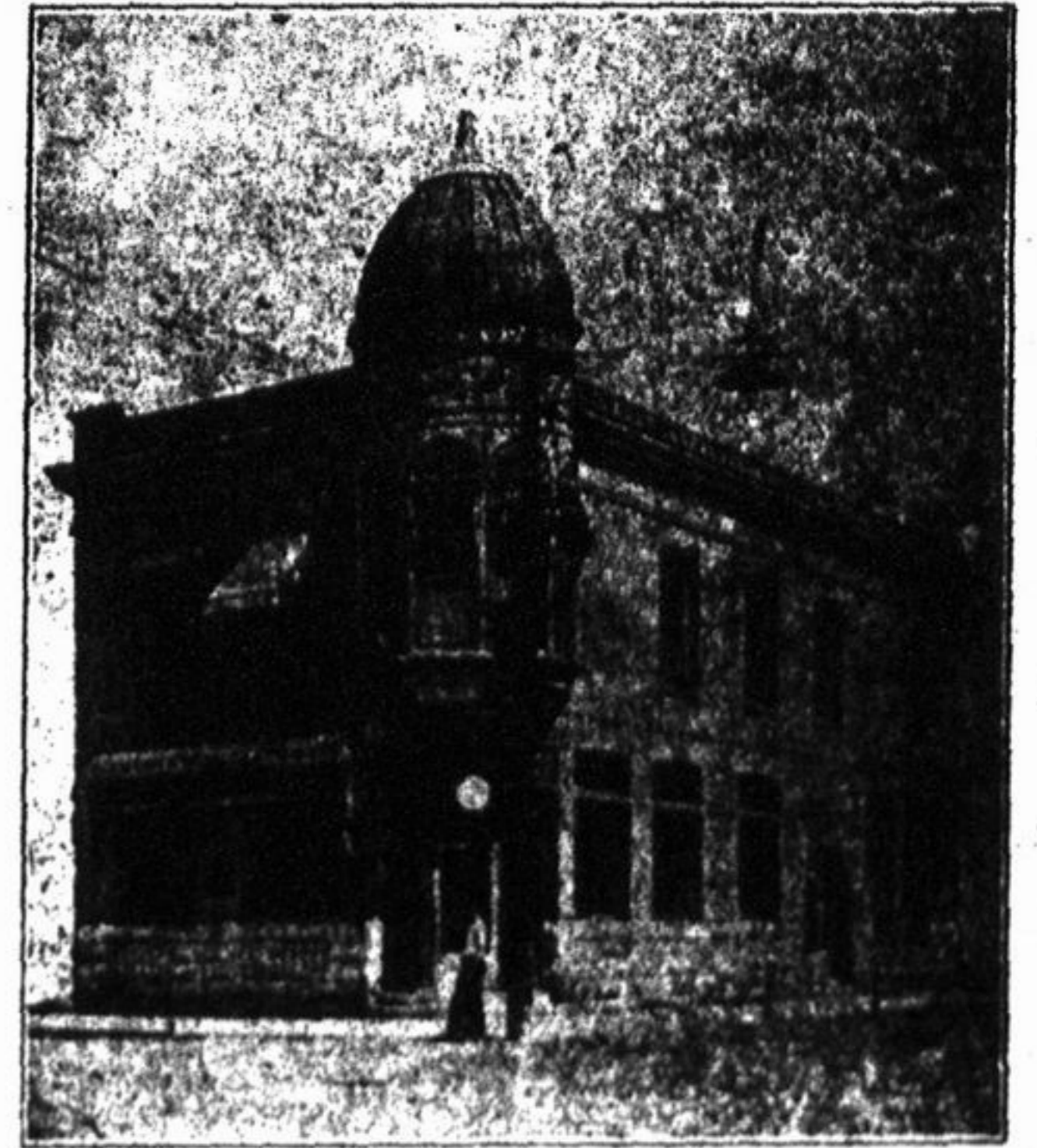
Much "Chow"—Home Variety—Music and Singing—Entire Community to take Part.

For weeks the banquet committee, L. R. Wells, J. W. Nash and Chas. Mochel, have been arranging this event and regular "chow" the home kind with lots of trimmings, has been prepared for the boys who in camp, on the march and in the trenches ate soldiers' rations.

The garage for the evening will be transformed into a banquet hall and through the generosity of subscribers to the Welcome Home fund there will be no lack of good things to eat.

Throughout the dinner the Welcome Orchestra, organized to do honor to our boys who fought the good fight, will play and their music will be supplemented by vocal selections by Benson's Quartette.

Members of Naper Post, No. 468, Grand Army of the Republic will be guests of honor with the younger veterans.

After the dinner and smokes the Community Welcome Home meeting will be held under the Service Flag.

The square will be lighted and with the returned boys words of welcome will be said by Dr. J. F. Jenness, who as pastor of the Methodist Church saw the boys go to the front and wished them Godspeed.

Another address will be given by Dr. Eneas B. Goodwin of St. Joseph's Church, who will speak of "Our Boys."

One of the veterans of the Great War will respond to the address of welcome but there will be no request that the boys tell their experiences at the front.

This week is "Boy Scout Week" all over the United States. In most towns good will and regular money raising is in progress. Aurora has set \$10,000 as her goal to help the scout movement there. Chicago is after one million. Hinsdale, LaGrange and other towns along the Burlington are donating to help their boys.

In Downers Grove the scout movement is just getting a good foothold. There are now three troops in Downers Grove.

Many parents do not understand the benefits for their boys in this scout work—morally, spiritually, mentally and physically or the troops would number even more.

More attention is now being paid to the Boy Scouts as a definite factor for constructive work with the youth of our country than ever before. For a number of years the boys with their few (comparatively) adult leaders got along somehow with not much interest or encouragement from the grown folks as a class. Today, however, some of our biggest national figures have interested themselves in the Boy Scout movement and are striving earnestly for national recognition of the value of the Scouting movement in the developing of our young boys.

In order to bring this about, President Wilson has by proclamation appointed next week, the week of June 8th to 14th, as Boy Scout Week, during which time Scouts and Scoutleaders throughout the nation will endeavor to bring before the people the following objectives:

First, to definitely recognize nationally the value of the Boy Scout movement and especially the achievements of the Boy Scouts nationally and locally during the war.

Second, bring to the attention of the citizenship of each community the vital facts with reference to its boyhood.

Third, interest churches, schools and other organizations which have a point of contact with boy life, so that there will be organized wherever possible, troops of Boy Scouts.

Fourth, give to men, especially to returning soldiers and sailors qualified to act as Scout leaders, an op-
