Charles H. Biermann, Chairman. On motion of Supervisor Fix, the Contract and Bond of Otto & Porter was approved and ordered to be made a matter of record.

CONTRACT

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors of Du Page County, Illinois, entered into a certain contract with E. D. Otto and A. L. Porter, doing business as Otto & Porter, for the furnishing of labor and material for the building and construction of a public cement highway on that portion of State Aid Road No. 1, known as Section J 15 D, which said contract is dated the 31st day of March, 1919, reference being thereto had for greater certainty; and

WHEREAS, The said Otto & Porter were obliged to furnish a certain bond to secure the faithful performance of the obligations of said contract; and whereas, the said Otto & Porter have presented to the said Board of Supervisors of Du Page County, Illinois, a certain bond signed by sureties; and whereas, the said Board of Supervisors feel that they should have certain protection over and above said bond that the terms of the said contract will be fully complied with, and that the moneys paid by the said Board of Supervisors shall be used for the purpose of furnishing material and labor in so building and constructing said road.

THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that it is agreed by and between the Board of Supervisors of Du Page County, party of the first part, and E. D. Otto and A. L. Porter, doing business as Otto & Porter, parties of the second part, and the First National Bank of Downers Grove, Illinois, parties of the third part, that upon estimates being made and furnished to the parties of the second part by the County Superintendent of Highways, as provided for in said contract, or oftener if agreed to by the parties hereto, that the said parties of the second part shall make a complete statement of all material and labor ordered by the parties of the second part and then due and unpaid, which statement shall be verified by affidavit by one or both of said co-partners, and that the said parties of the second part shall designate to the said County Superintendent of Highways how much of the estimate shall be paid to the various material and labor men, and that upon the said parties of the second part shall draw their checks payable to said material men and labor men, and that all such checks shall be counter-

signed by E. L. Gates, County Superintendent of Highways, or in his absence, inability or refusal to act then George Fix, Supervisor of Milton Township.

It is further agreed by and between the parties hereto that the parties of the first part shall draw vouchers payable to the said parties of the second part for all moneys which become due from time to time to the parties of the second part, and that the parties of the first part shall deliver such check, or vouchers to the party of the third part, and that the party of the third part shall hold said vouchers until endorsed by the parties of the second part, and then deposited to the credit of the party of the second part in the bank of the parties of the third part, and to hold the same until the same is paid out upon checks drawn by the parties of the second part countersigned by the said E. L. Gates, County Superintendent of Highways, or in his absence, refusal or inability to act then George Fix, Supervisor of Du Page County.

It is further agreed by and between the parties hereto that the said parties of the second part shall each be entitled to draw from said fund so deposited by the parties of the first part with the party of the third part a sum not to exceed fifty (\$50.00) Dollars per week each from said fund upon checks countersigned as heretofore set forth.

It is further agreed that the party of the third part shall hold said funds until the same are checked out in accordance with the above plan.

It is further agreed that when said work is completed and approved in accordance with the contract above mentioned and the plans and specifications thereto attached, and all claims for labor and material have been paid, that the said parties of the second part shall be entitled to whatever balance there may be remaining of said fund in said bank.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the parties of the second part have set their hands and seals, and the parties of the first and third part have caused the same to be executed and the seals of said corporations attached, this 15 day of May, A. D. 1919.

abandon said contract, or be lawfully compelled by the Obligee to cease operations thereunder, by reason of the non-performance of any of its terms or conditions, by the Principal, then the Sureties shall have the right in their option to assume the said contract and to submit or complete the same; and if said contract shall be assumed by the Sureties, then as such contract is duly performed, any reserve, deferred payments and all other moneys provided by said contract to be paid to the Principal, shall be paid to the Sureties, at the same times and under the same conditions as by the terms thereof, such moneys would have been paid to the Principal had the contract been duly performed by said Principal; and if said Obligee shall complete or reject the said contract, then any forfeitures provided in said contract against the Principal, shall not be operative as against the sureties, but all reserves, deferred payments and all other moneys provided in said contract, which would have been paid to the Principal had the Principal completed the contract in accordance with its terms, shall be credited upon any claim the said Obligee may make upon said Sureties.

The Sureties shall not be liable under this bond to any one except the Obligee, except as hereinafter provided. But it is agreed that the Obligee, in estimating its damage, may include the claims of mechanics and material men arising out of the performance of the contract and paid by said Obligee only when the same by the Statutes of this State are valid liens against the property of the Obligee.

The Sureties shall not be liable for any damages resulting from an act of God, or from a mob, riot, civil commotion or public enemy, or from so-called "strikes" or labor difficulties, or from accident, fire, lightning, tornado or cyclones, and the Sureties shall not be liable for the reconstruction or repair of any work or materials damaged by said causes or any of them.

This obligation is further conditioned that the Principal will perform the work in accordance with the terms of the contract with the said Obligee, and with the plans and specifications thereto attached, and that they will commence and complete the work with in the time prescribed in said contract.

The said Principal and Sureties shall also be liable for any direct or indirect damages that may be suffered or claimed by the Obligee on account of such construction or improvement during the time thereof and until the work is completed; provided, the full amount of this bond shall be conditioned also upon the payment by the contractor of all sums of money due for any labor, material, apparatus, fixtures or machinery so furnished and put in place by any person for the recovery of such moneys.

The said Sureties shall not be liable for an amount in excess of the penalty of this bond.
