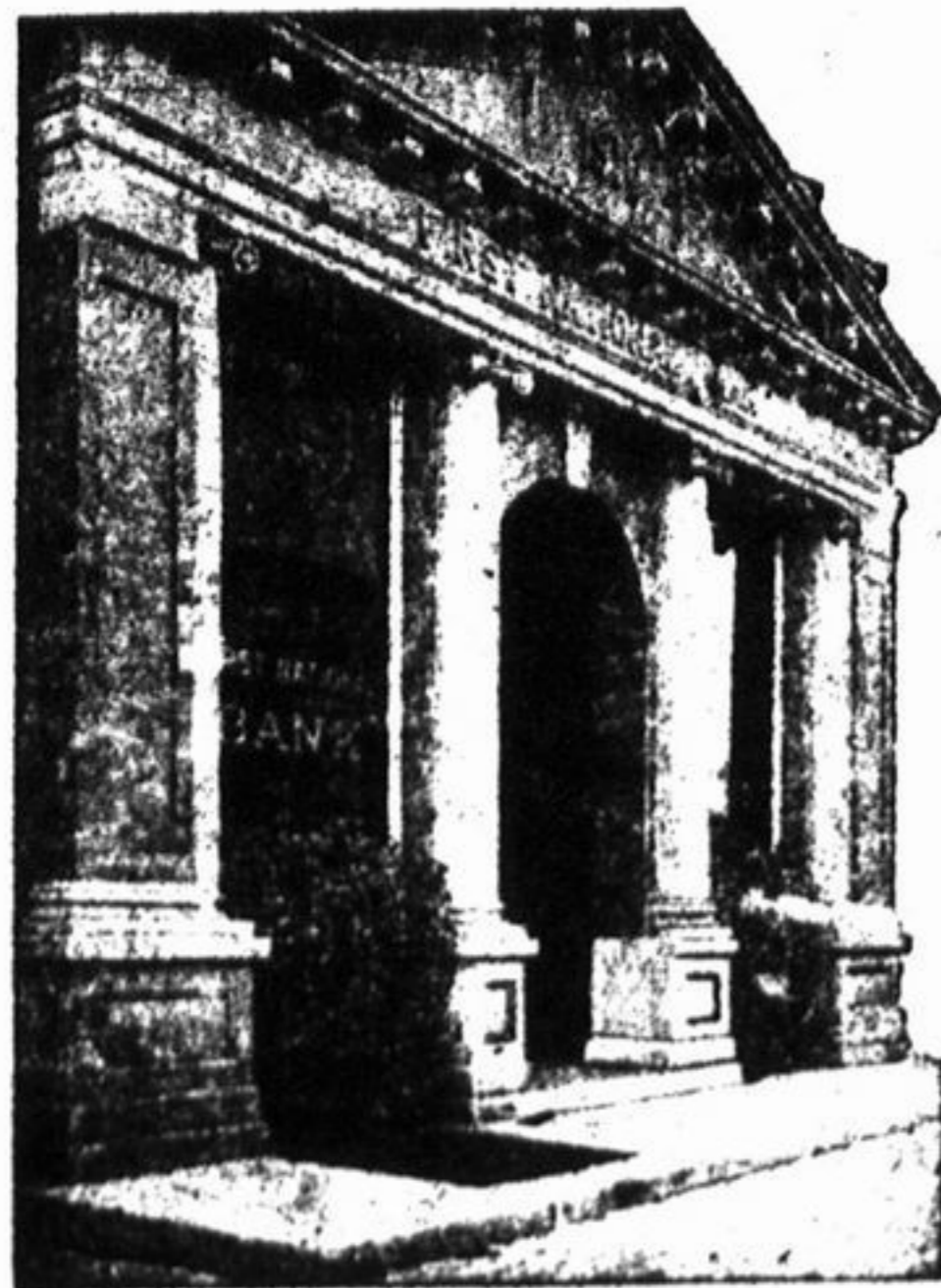

Each game will be unique in the annals of sporting event. Each player will wear the uniform he wore during the world war; the gobs appearing in immaculate whites and the army in khaki. How long the navy uniforms will remain white depends on the number of times they slide to second. Each side is preparing to cop the honors by putting in as strong a team as possible and old Downers Grove stars who played on the high school and town teams will defend their respective branch of service. "Ted" Curtiss and "Scoop" Mochel who have been team mates on the Chicago "U" team will oppose each other Saturday. Shanabrook, the two Nash boys and Norm Andersen will play with the army, while Ehninger, Friedenbogen, Curtiss and Davis will play with the navy. They will be led by Boy Scout buglers and drummers. In the short time since the game was proposed intense rivalry has sprung up between the teams and rooters.
