## CIVIL SERVICE **EXAMS REOPENED** TO DISCHARGED

Under an opinion of the Attorney General recently rendered to the Civi Service Commission. United States soldiers, sailors and marines who misand apportunity to enter civil service estaminations because of their military or naval service may now be given a chance to qualify for Government

Service Commission, dishing to give discharged service en every oppourtunity to qualify for civil positions, asked the Altorney General for an opinson as to whether to open, for the ment of honorably discharged soldiers, sailors and marines, examinations which had been closed. The Atterney General having expressed a consion that such action is legal in view of the spirit of a recent act Congress which provides for preerence in appointment to civil postions for discharged service men. the Civil Service Commission will open to honorably discharged service nen examinations which were pending April 6, 1917, the date of Ameries's declaration of war, or which ware subsequently announced, and for hich registers of eligibles now exist.
