

PRINTING TRADE WORKERS GIVEN **BOOST IN WAGES**

Friday, August 22, 1919

Those engaged in the printing trades; compositors, feeders ,pressmen, bindery workers, etc., were given a boost in wages the first of the week. At a meeting held last Sunday at which representatives of the employers and employees met the wage scale was agreed upon. About \$5.00 a week increase was granted all down the line, making the scale for printers \$41 per week.

Negotiations have been in progress for several weeks, the bone of contention being a 44 hour week asked for by the union. This was refused. The "big 6", the New York Typographical Union is holding out for the shorter week with a good chance

of winning the argument. This boost in wages, coupled with the rapidly rising cost of raw materials, paper, inks, etc., will send the cost of printing up another notch.
