Drive For Funds for Roosevelt Memorial Will Begin in Illinois Soon.

All over the State of Illinois the American Legion is preparing to give whole-hearted support to the Roosevelt Memorial Association's campaign for \$750,000 with which to erect monuments, parks and endowments in honor of the great ex-President. Without exception the returned soldiers and sailors revere the memory of the hero of San Juan hill and the one American who first saw and preached the need of national preparedness. When the drive starts October 20th

the military men will be on hand recounting the Colonel's personal bravery, his Spartan fortitude in sending his four sons to the war and his firmness in the face of the disaster which befell him when his son Quentin was killed in his airplane, and his sons Theodore Jr. and Archie were wounded in France.

With the addition of the American Legion to those bodies that will assist in the non-partisan, non-class, non-sectarian campaign, organization nears completion in Illinois. Some of the county chairmen are yet to be chosen but the congressional district chairmen's reports daily show splendid progress toward completion of the organization of their counties. In the farming communities particularly the drive will be quickly over it is freely predicted at the Association head-

quarters, for "Teddy's" popularity with all men who live in the open was proverbial, and his nearness to the staunch Americanism of the Middle Western farmer was always a noteworthy thing.

Outside of Chicago the state's quota is \$300,000 and it is known that the emphasis of the campaign will not be spent so much on the speed with which this is raised as on the accumulation of great numbers of the signers. The size of the membership being of more importance than the size of the contributions, since the principal aim of the drive is to bring home to as many people as possible the high idealism and Americanism that dictated the Colonel's life, thoughts and actions. Those in charge would rather have a dime from one hundred people than a dollar from ten people.

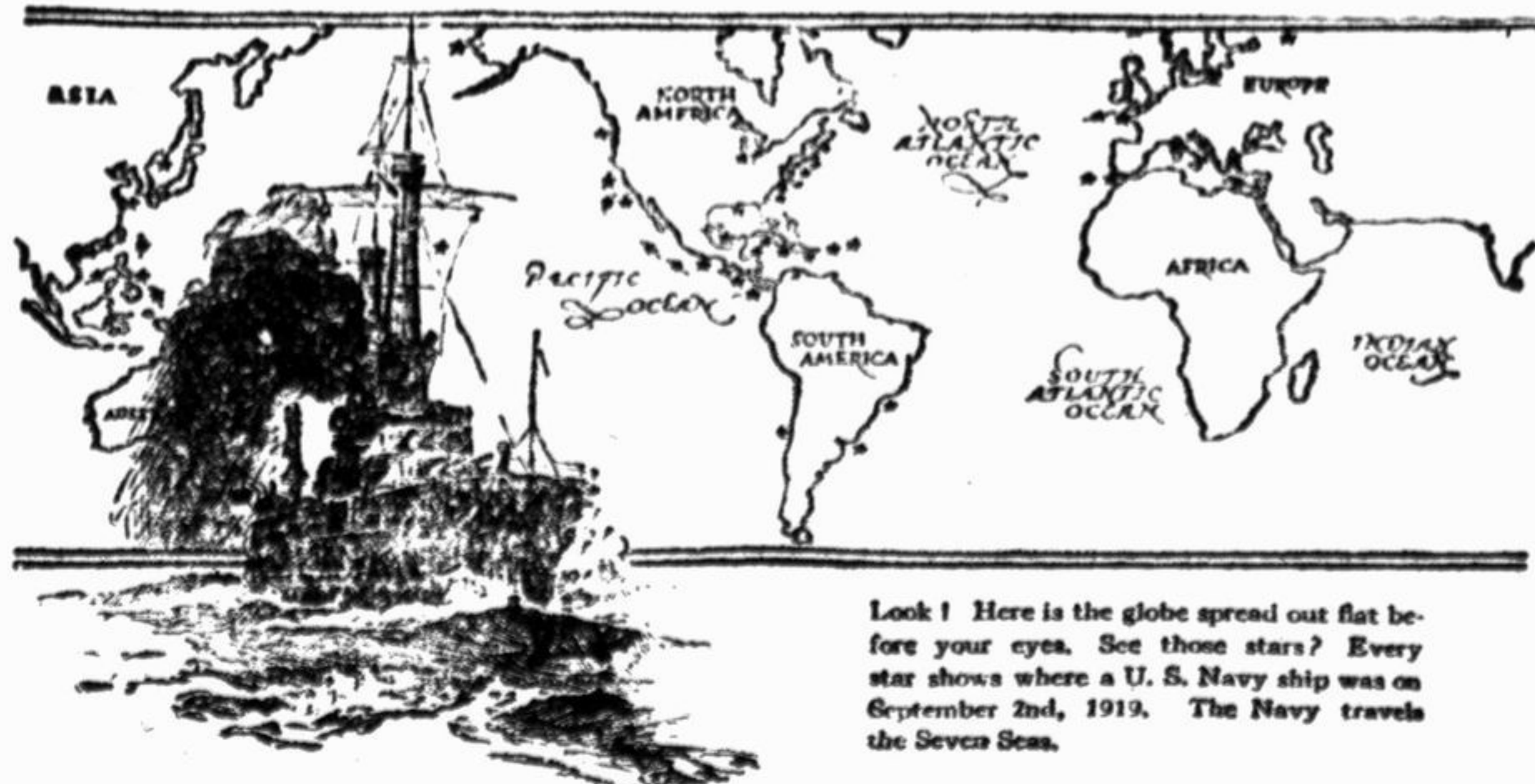
