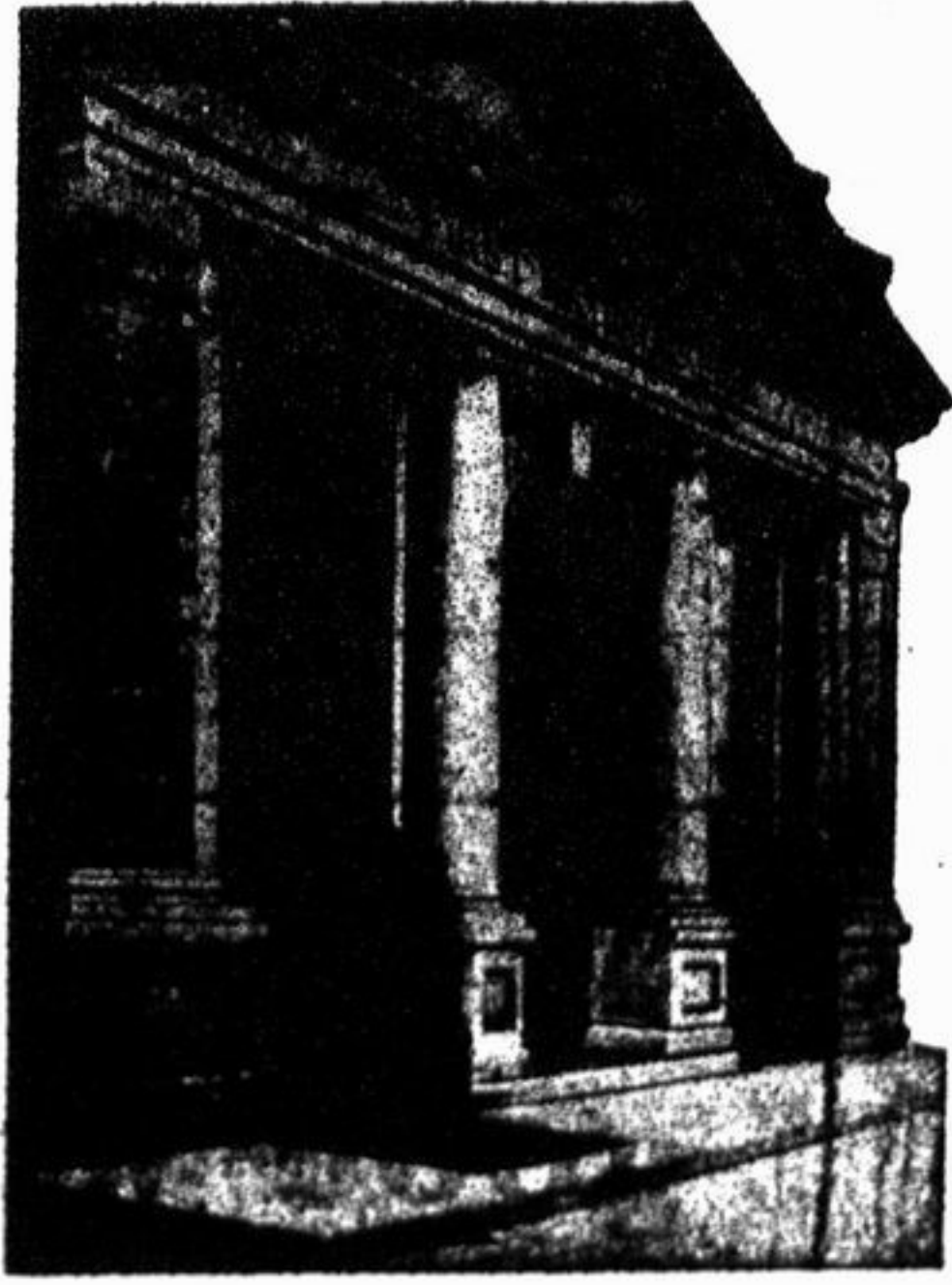

or if they died of disease either here or abroad, will make no difference. Their lives were given that the weaker peoples of the earth should not suffer in the future from militaristic powers as they have in the past.

Several weeks ago those of our boys who came safely back from their service in the army and the navy, received the county medals at Wheaton. At that time it was recognized by the committee of Supervisors in charge that some suitable recognition be made of those who will never come back, and the gold star hero medal is the result.

The medal is the same as was presented at Wheaton except that it is gold plated and the bar to which it is attached is also gold plated with the name of the man engraved on its shining surface.

C. B. Blodgett, of Downers Grove, who has done more than any other supervisor for the veterans of the wars in which the United States has been engaged than any other county representative, has charge of the purchasing and distributing of the memorials.

The list of the county's dead has been checked up by Mr. Blodgett and the surviving relatives of our heroes will be presented with the medal.

With each one will go a copy of the following resolution, passed at a recent meeting of the Board of Supervisors. The name of the man will be engraved on the resolutions.

Wheaton, DuPage County, Illinois, October 6th., 1919.

Whereas..... responded to the call of his County to take up arms in defense of Justice, Freedom and Democracy, and

Whereas, in the performance of his duty he made the supreme sacrifice, winning for himself immortal honor and the gratitude of the nation,

HEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT we, the members of the Board

eleventh. Twenty-five years ago the parish was instituted with a minister at Lae who traveled around the circuit preaching to members of this denomination. Eleven years ago the local church was established with a resident pastor and during that time has been steadily growing in power.

The celebration Sunday is also a jubilation over the payment of \$1,200 on the church parsonage which was subscribed in a few days' work by the financial committee.
