"The Last of The Duanes" is a most realistic presentation of day-of-border terrorism in Texas and certain scenes were filmed at risk of life and limb.



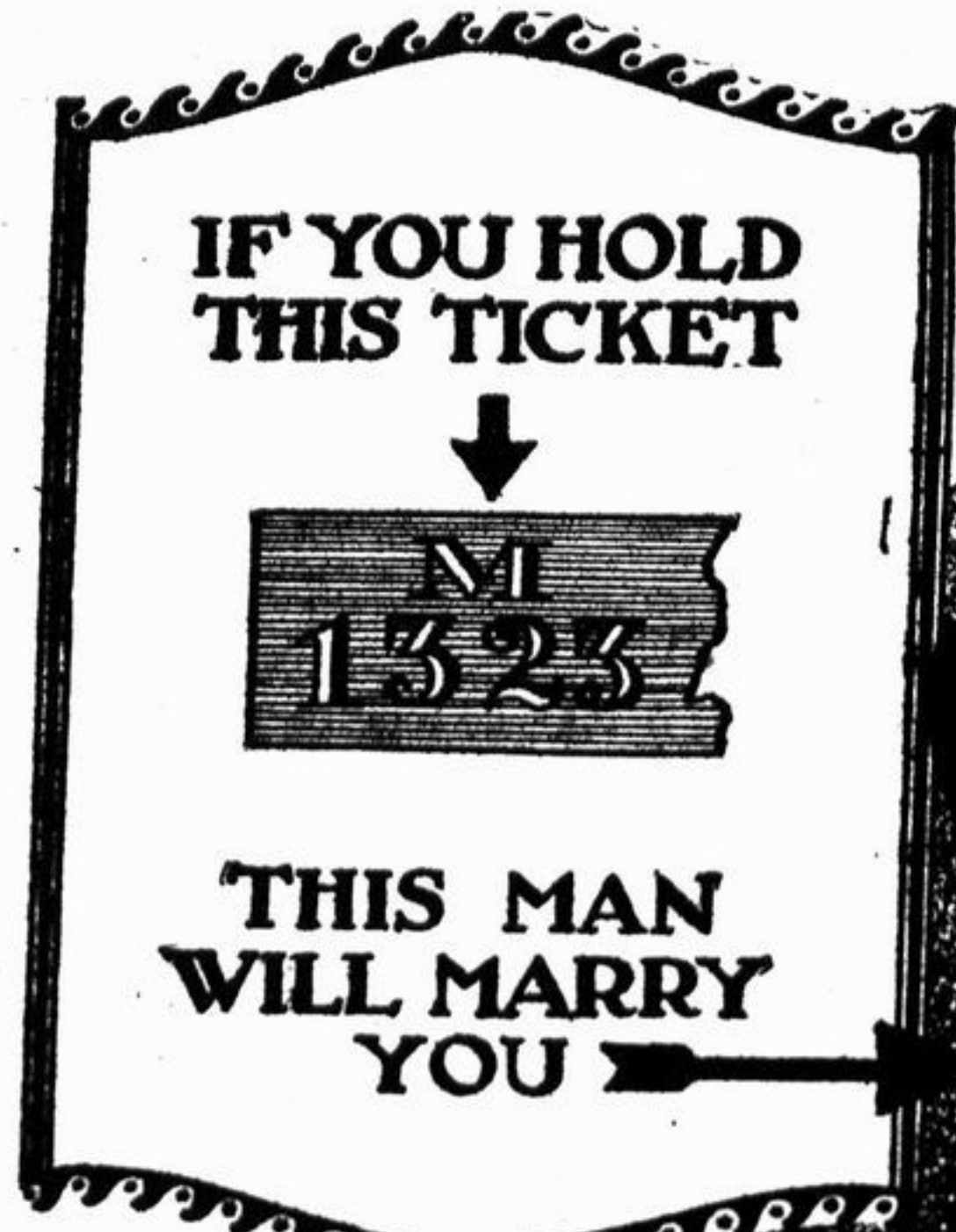

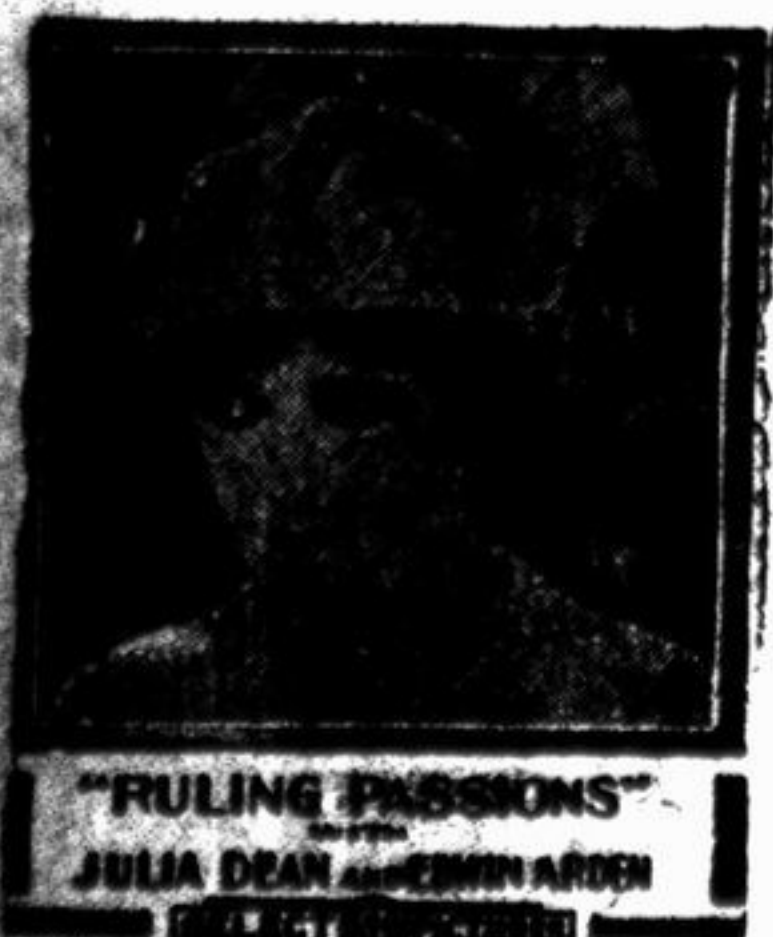
