Downers Grove's coal dealers, the Lord Lumber Co., the Potter Manufac\_ turing & Lumber Co., and Mertz & Mochel are co-operating as per instructions of the Regional Fuel Director, regarding the delivery of coal. The fuel regulations as promulgated require that no coal be delivered to homes unless the supply has run to Do your Christmas Shopping at home Buy Red Cross Christmas Seals below a ton. This regulation will protect everyone and will so enable the dealers to distribute the supply so that no one will suffer.

People should do all in their power to help the situation by not ordering unless their supply is low enough to warrant it. One instance will show how some folks are trying to evade the rules. One woman called a dealer Monday and said she would have to have some coal immediately as she had just put the last of her supply in the stove. A wagon was loaded and dispatched to her home. The driver investigated the basement and he found nearly five tons of coal in the bin. Of course she didn't get any

This is only one case that has come to light in the present shortage. People are prone to blame dealers. However, they should not as these men are working hard to get more coal to the village and to see that what is on hand is delivered as it should They have no alternative as they are under orders.
