Do your Christmas buying at home.

At a recent meeting of the North American Indian Society held in Chicago at which time seventeen tribes were represented (a society under the auspices of the Chicago Historical Society) Capt. Parker of Downers Grove, Ill., read the legend of Wana-to of the Algonquin and Seneca tribe, a paper written by him for the Archaeology Society April 1913.

It relates to their marriage custom during the first part of the eighteenth century. The story was given to the Captain by Col. T. J. Parker who was adopted by the Senecas in 1836, the legend was given to him by Chief Jameson, who commanded the tribe on the American side during the war of 1812-14. The Colonel died in 1910 at the age of 96. The Algonquins once a powerful tribe on the shores of the Lake and St. Lawrence river, the word comes from the missionaries and historical writers of New France
