Select ten ears of same length Choose ears with straight rows and solid cars. Take out one or two kernels from each ear and examine carefully for black chit. Chit. or heart must be white or cream colored. Take ears with kernels of the same depth, and same roughness at the crown or top. White ears must have white cobs, yellow ears must have red cobs. No white kernels are allowed in a yellow ear or yellow kernels in a white ear.

Small Grain Exhibits

Grade the wheat, oat and barley exhibits. Fan all chaff and weed seeds from sample. Hand pick all weed seed not removed by fanning mill or grader, if you so desire. Exhibits should not be musty. The largest, most plump and cleanest exhibits will be the ones that will win prizes.
