

If you have a "cold," particularly when influenza is prevalent, don't infect other people-keep away from

If You Have a "Cold"

Rest in bed is the best insurance and operated by the state. against a serious attack.

Rest in bed is the best assurance against pneumonia and other serious complications.

Rest in bed is the best assurance of speedy recovery.

Rest in bed is the best assurance againt the common serious after-effects such as "flu-heart," and tuberculosis, and extreme exhaustion.

Rest in bed is the best way to avoid spreading infection to others.

Go to bed on the first appearance of illness and remain in bed at least five days after fever has disappeared regardless of how well you may feel. Follow your doctor's directions ab-

See that sputum and discharges of the nose and throat are received in crean cloths or paper napkins and that the cloths or napkins are burned immediately after being used,

Always sleep alone in case of any "cold." This is imperative in case influenza is prevalent.

If you have influenza, see that the case is reported to the local health authorities. If you do not have physician, remember that the law requires your nurse, attendant, parent ir any householder to report the ease Failure to report is ponishable by fine up to two hundred dollars, o imprisonment in the county jail of both. It is obligatory upon the local health officer to prosecute all per--one guilty of violation of this rule Any person suffering from influ

enza must be quarantined until five 5) days after his temperature ha returned to normal. This is impera tive both for the safety of the pa teent and for the protection of other-

The war has proved to the beligerent countries that they had been careless in their neglect of mothers and children, so even under the strain of war they intensified their effort for the public protection of mothers and

England increased the number of "health visitors" from 600 in 1914 to 1024 in 1917; welfare centers in England and Wales increased from 850 in 1917 to 1278 in 1918. The English infant mortality rate was reduced to the lowest point ever reached in that country.

As a further aid to meet an actual need England passed in 1918 the Maternal and Child Welfare bill, which became operative in that year. By the provision of the act maternity and infant welfare centers are made available to mothers. Provisions are made for consultations, public health rurses, "home helps" and the education of mothers in matters of mater-

lous; but if neglected, serious and fatal complications occur. Death is usually due to preumonia and, occasionally, to inflamation of the ear or meningitis. Active tuber colosis often follows in the wake of an influenza epidemic. In most in

To acquire influenza, there must always be a source of infection. To avoid the disease, the thing to do to avoid that source of infection. Remember that influenza is spread by spitters, sneezers, and coughers, and by infected hands, cating and drink-

Avoid contact with persons who have colds. What appears to be ordinary cold may be influenza.

Keep out of crowds. In every possible way, avoid close contact with others. Work, sleep and live in the fresh air. Avoid dusty places. Re member that the germs of influenza may be found in the street dust, in the dried sputum of spitters.


Eat your meals regulary and have plenty of simple, nourishing food. Do not permit yourself to get over-tired. Avoid chilling the body. Dress com-

Wet feet demand immediate attention. Remove wet clothing as soon as possible.

Keep your hands clean and keep your fingers out of your mouth.

Do not visit the sick. You may carry infection to them or they may infect you. During an epidemic of influenza, all sick persons should be egarded as possible victims of the aisease and should be avoided. While most cases of influenza are marked by definite symptoms such as reddened eyes, discharging nose and achng muscles, these symptoms may all be absent. Regard all illness as suspiciou and probably infectious when
