A. L. WEBSTER A REGISTERED LAND SURVEYOR

An act of the last legislature required that all Surveyors practicing in the counties with populations of 250,000 or more, shall be required to register, and take out a license. Failure to do so is punishable by fine.

The act at present applies only to Cook County, but a number of Surveyors in other counties are taking out licenses. About 70 so far have registered in Cook County. A. L. Webster, our County Surveyor at Wheaton, has certificate number 30.

Properties of Zinc. Zinc is ductile between 212 and 302 degrees Fahrenheit, and can then be shaped as required. But when either above or below these limits it becomes brittle and unpliant, and therefore not adapted for treatment. It melts at about 786 degrees Fahrenheit if volatilization is guarded against.

HELD FOR DEFRAUDING RELATIVES OF DEAD SOLDIERS

Washington, Feb. 21.—Vernon A. Callar, 38, a Virginian, was today held to the federal grand jury on a charge of using the mails to defraud hundreds of bereaved relatives of American soldiers reported dead or missing. The offense which figured in his arraignment today was the obtaining of funds from Mrs. John B. Bryan of Downers Grove, Ill., on the pretext of furnishing transportation home for her son, John B. Bryan Jr., formerly with the marine corps.

Bryan was reported missing in action by the War Department. Callar wrote Mrs. Bryan that he had found her son, that he had deserted and would not appeal to the authorities for help for fear that he would be imprisoned.

Mrs. Bryan knew her son wasn't the kind to desert and turned the letter over to the Marine Corps headquarters in Washington. Callar's arrest followed. He has confessed to sending hundreds of messages for funds to bereaved women in Illinois, Iowa, Michigan and Missouri.
