Welch of Austin, Master in Chancery, Chicago, Ill., will speak to the older boys of Du Page County at the opening session of the 3rd DuPage County Conference for Older Boys on Friday evening, April 16th. Any boy between the ages of 16 and 20 who fails to avail himself of this opportunity to hear Judge Welch will miss something which will, without doubt, mean dollars and cents, as well as satisfaction and common sense to him a few years hence.

The 3rd DuPage County Conference for Older Boys is again promoted under the auspices of the DuPage County Sunday School Association, of which Mr. R. A. Waite of Wheaton is chairman. The Naperville Y. M. C. A., of whose board Mr. J. T. Moyer is president, and the DuPage County Y. M. C. A., Walter A. Rogers of Lisle, chairman.

This year's Conference will be held at Glen Ellyn, starting at 7:30 Friday evening, and running through Saturday the 17th, closing with a banquet. Other speakers at this conference are Mr. A. B. Ransopher of the Chicago Boys' Club, Captain S. F. Beatty of Hinsdale, Mr. C. B. Bowman, Naperville, County Superintendent of Schools and others.

The general theme of the conference is "Leadership for the New Day" and any boy who is interested in making the most of himself and in being trained for a position of responsibility for the future should register as a delegate either through his local school, the Hi Y Club, or some organized Sunday School Class. The registration fee is only \$1.50, and entitles the delegate to a seat at the banquet which will be served by the Ladies' Aid of the Glen Ellyn M. E. church. The residents of Glen Ellyn are prepared to entertain free of charge any delegates who wish entertainment over Friday night.

TO THE VOTERS

Extract from Road & Bridge Law. The highway commissioner of each town or road district shall have power and it shall be his duty:

Article 5: To direct the construction and repair of roads and bridges within the town or district, to let contracts, employ labor and purchase material and machinery therefor, subject to the limitations herein provided: PROVIDED HOWEVER, that no contract shall be let for the construction or repair of any road or bridge or part thereof, in the excess of an amount of \$200.00, nor shall any machinery or other appliances to be used in road construction, in excess of such amount be purchased without the approval of the county superintendent of highways.

**LOCAL BAPTIST
CHURCH ASKED
TO RAISE \$12,718**

Great Sum to be Spent by Denomination in Spiritualization and Education.

Dr. Judson B. Thomas, State Campaign Director of the Northern Baptist Convention, following a three day conference held last week at the Great Northern hotel in Chicago, today made known the quotas of the churches of the Chicago Baptist Association in the \$100,000,000 drive, which will be conducted during the eight day drive beginning April 25th.

The quota of the Downers' Grove Baptist church is \$12,718.

The Campaign is said to be the

greatest undertaking ever contemplated by any single denomination. The entire sum will be spent in spiritualization and education. In America, 88 Baptist academies, colleges and universities will be built up. The salaries of the pastors will be increased. Intensified work among foreign language speaking people will be carried on through the establishing of community houses and in home mission work.

More than one-tenth of the sum,

will be used in founding hospitals and new missions in foreign lands as well as increasing the efficiency of the missions and other institutions already being operated by them.
