TO THE VOTERS

Extract from Road & Bridge Law The highway commissioner of each town or road district shall have power and it shall be his duty:

Article a: To direct the construction and repair of roads and bridge: within the town or district, to let contracts, employ labor and purchase material and machinery therefor, subject to the limitations herein provided: PROVIDED HOWEVER, that no contract shall be let for the construction or repair of any road or bridge or part thereof, in the excess of an amount of \$200,00, nor shall any machinery or other appliances to be used in road construction, in excess of such amount be purchased without the approval of the county superintendent of nighways.


