

RESUME OF 1919-20 D. G. H. S. BASKETBALL SEASON

Summary Shows Locals Scored 349 Points to Opponents 337. Lost Many Games.

At the beginning of the season five letter men of last year reported for practice. Due to accidents and other hindrances the team got a bad start not having their regular lineup in any of the first games.

Immediately after the County tournament the fellows braced and putting up a brand new brand of ball. Several teams which had previously defeated us were met and subdued. Naperville was given a hot battle at Elgin and the season closed with a victory over the beloved Alumni.

Shurte and Bush playing at forward position were a pair which have no superiors in the county. Each scored consistently.

Grumhaus and Allison also did a good share of the scoring frequently and generally holding their opponents to a limited number of field goals. "Grummy" played center and running guard while Allison played forward and floor guard. Boon completed the five. He played defensive guard.

Morton, Tyler and Phelps also did good work. Tyler and Leroy should prove valuable next year as they are the only two men who played in a number of the first team games, to return again.

Shurte, Bush, Allison, Grumhaus, Tyler, Boon and Morton all receive major letters.
