

EASTER AT ST. JOSEPH'S

Church Was a Gem of Interior Setting at Biggest of the Church Festivals.

Despite the extraordinary inclemency of the weather Sunday, St. Joseph's church was crowded at the 8 a. m. low Mass account a seemingly universal desire on the part of the congregation to go to Holy Communion.

Easter is indeed the Feast Day supreme in the Catholic calendar, and on this day the old Mother Church proceeds on the assumption that nothing is too good for the Tabernacle of the Risen Lord. Accordingly, the most beautiful flowers decorate Her Altars—the finest strains of Music's charms are called upon by Her Choirs—all for the ministering to Man's artistic sensibilities, which inevitably, through Nature's laws, exercises such a large influence upon our religious life.

St. Joseph's, a gem of interior setting, on this occasion seemed to be veritably a treasure-trove for the eye particularly with the soft-toned wealth of coloring in its new Art Windows; and it was noticeable the more too, because of the somberly severe atmosphere of Holy Week, when everything is always covered with Penitencia's purple garb—the Altar itself bereft of its Host, a sort of desertion that so distinctly recalls our Lord's own desertion by His followers and makes the church seem a place cold and bare. Hence the forcefulness of the contrast, when on Easter Morn' all is regnant with a joyous Hope, and Faith smiles o'er all our tears. Christ has mastered Death.

Dr. Goodwin grew reminiscent of mood, and in a sort of heart to heart talk informed his people that his 15th Easter as pastor here, also was the year of his Silver Ordination Anniversary—June next marking the 25th milestone of his admission to the Priesthood.

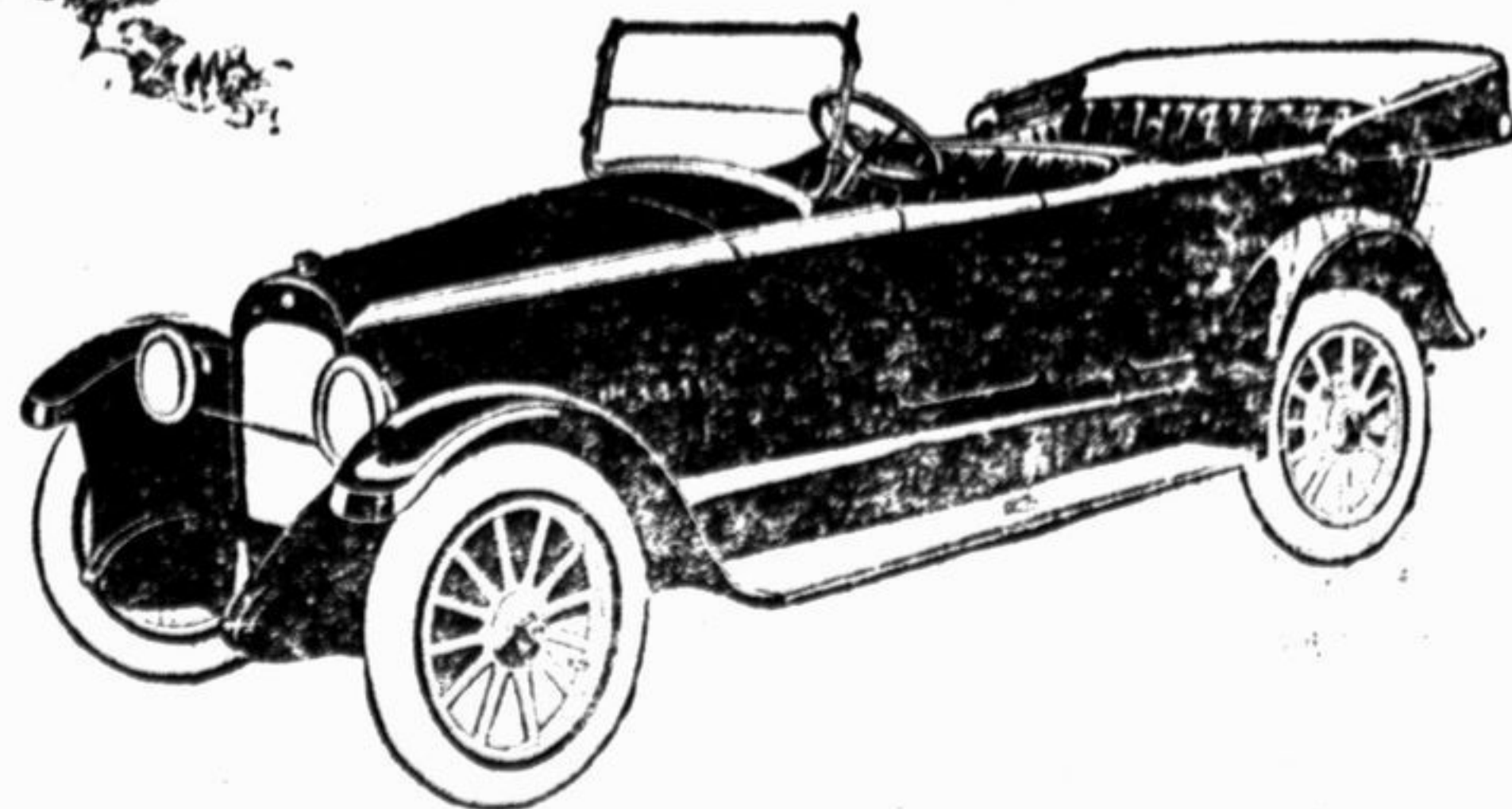
