

### LOCAL BAPTIST CHURCH FACING A "BIG TASK"

Start Next Sunday to Raise Their Share of the 100,000,000 Dollars Pledged.

The churches which compose the Northern Baptist Convention are to conduct a great campaign to raise \$100,000,000 for "The New World Movement" during the eight days April 25-May 2, 1920. The amount asked of the Downers Grove Baptist church is over twelve thousand dollars, pledges for which are to be made next Sunday and the week following, to cover the four year period 1920-1924.

The Advisory Committee of the local church met at close of the morning service last Sunday and appointed Deacon M. V. Morton, Campaign Director. A meeting is to be held in the parsonage, Thursday evening, for the appointment of teams and the arrangement of other details preparatory to starting the canvass next Sunday.

This is looked upon as the unparalleled opportunity of Northern Baptists in the great movement for World Evangelization. Success depends upon each individual Baptist doing his and her BEST!

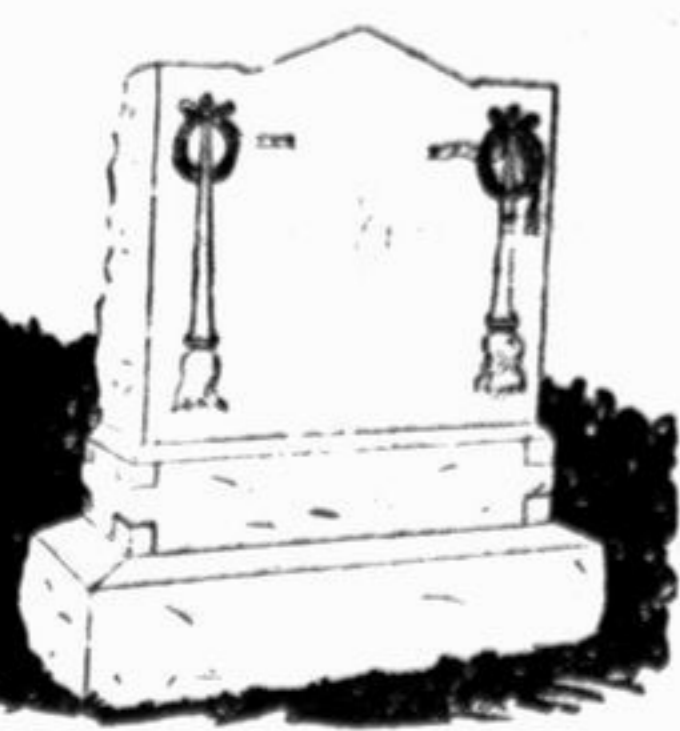

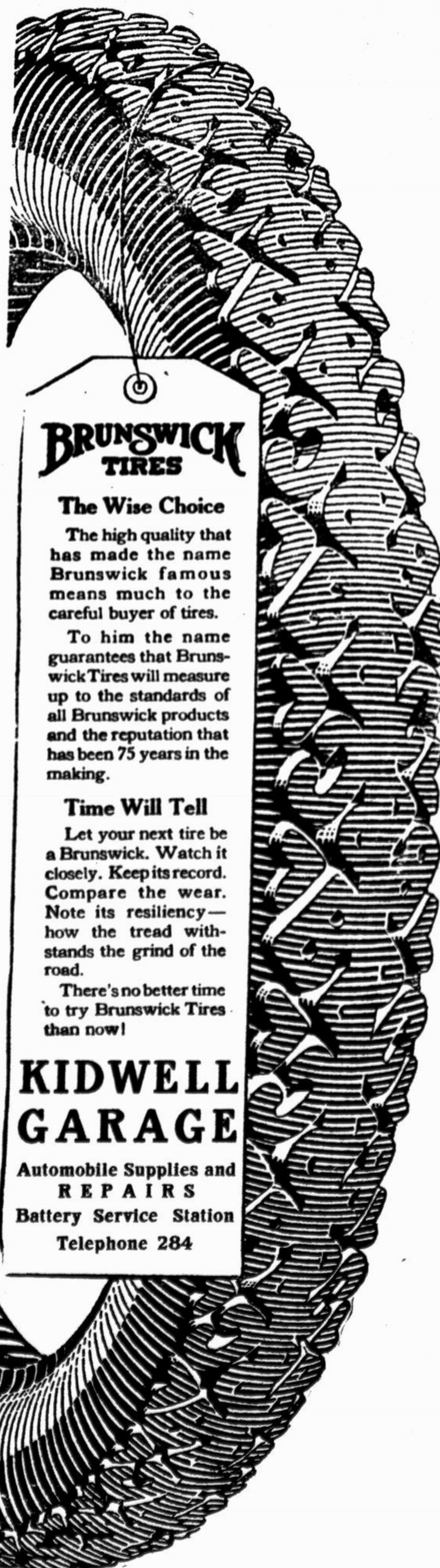
