SAN DIEGO CELEBRATED BIRTHDAY OF O. J. STOUGH

Founder of Hinsdale, 102 Years Old. Led the Grand March in California. Several weeks ago the city of San Diego, California, celebrated the 102 birthday of O. J. Stough with appropriate ceremonies, at the Cabrillo Club. Every organization of the city and delegations from all over the state were present to pay tribute to Mr. Stough who for so many years has been identified with the growth and progressiveness of the California city. After a dinner and entertainment Mr. Stough opened the ball at nine o'clock by leading the grand march with a kinswoman, Mrs. Isabelle Churchill, who was formerly a resident of Downers Grove. Mr. Stough was born in Mason-town, Pa. He is a veteran of the Mexican and Civil wars and draws a pension for his services in the former. He is known as the founder of Hinsdale as he was the first to call the attention of Chicago people to that suburb. He made many additions to the village and lived there for years before going to California. He is the eldest Elk in the United States and was the first president of the Chicago Humane Society.
