I am going to take the liberty o asking all the readers just to spend a few moments with me, talking over a problem of mutual interest,

First of all. might I ask whether you have been in a Telephone Exchange and seen the girls working at the switchboard? If you have, so much the better, if not let us talk stroyed. simply about it, because Telephone Service is rendered by girls with the use of all kinds of very delicate apperatus.

Some six years ago Telephone operators, these girls, had been receiving about \$45.00 a month. \$9.00 or \$10.00 a week, as a matter of fact, Sunday-8 a. m., Mass, reading of out of which they could pay their way

Is there any girl that can live and pay her way and have what she Men's Sodality meets on the fifth cught to have, as you and I. as fathgirls, now need \$70.00 or \$80.00 a Holy hour adoration every Friday month to get along with, and that isn't so very much as things go now.

The extra \$30.00 or \$40.00 a month for each girl doesn't drop from the clouds and it must come from the subscribers, whom these girls are serving. Very well, so far alright.

Now about six years ago the Telephone Exchange, fairly large in size, could be run on, say in round figuring, just for example, \$10,000 a month so the Telephone Company needed at least this \$10,000 and a little bit more, say about \$100, that is about the ratio, for interest on borrowed public money. But we need not think much about the other \$100, it is so small, in fact, I doubt if it costs onetenth of a cent a call for interest and dividends, so that this amount won't ruin anybody.

The main problem is that the girls and the other workers in the Telephone Industry, have got to live the same as anybody else. The majority of the people living in this town know these employes or some one connected with them, at least, they

BORAX USED IN FERTILIZER

Container Must Be Properly Marked According to Order of Secre. tary of Agriculture.

A recent order signed under the control act by the secretary of agriculture, and issued by the bureau of soils of the United States department of agriculture provides as follows: "That hereafter no licensee handling

or dealing in fertilizers or fertilizer ingredients shall sell for application to the soil any mixed fertilizer which contains more than one-tenth of 1 per cent of boron, expressed as anhydrous borax, unless the container thereon ly, as part of the analysis, the per centage of borax present."


