Assessor's Reports Show Value of Personal Property, Lots and and Farm Lands.

According to returns made by the assessors there are 7499 horses in the county, with an average assessment of \$45.82; 22,178 cattle, \$28.36 each; 171 mules, \$45.84; 1,523 sheep, \$4.70; 10,814 hogs, \$9.50; 333 steam engines \$180.87; 159 safes, \$15.16; 2,547 automobiles, \$139.42; 2,891 pianos, \$41.36; \$600; 720 in household furniture; \$47,790 in grain, total value in personal property, \$5,872,211, agricultural tools, \$120,960; diamonds and jewelry, \$15,459; improved lands, 194,344 acres at an average assessed value of \$44.12 per acre, with improvements; 33,554 town and city lots with improvements, at an average value of \$248.98 each.
