Occasionally a subscriber inquires why it is necessary for the Chicago Telephone Company to ask for an adjustment of its rates for telephone service. Yet at the same time the inquirer generally adds that he realizes that under present, past and future conditions the Utility should have an adjustment.

The only reason that an adjustment of rates is necessary is because the Telephone Company has already realized that its employees could not exist upon the old scale of wages, and consequently increased the scale all along the line to a very considerable degree. Added to this is the increased price of all material used in the business. To meet these expenses the Utility needs an adjustment of rates.

This is the reason and the only reason. If it were not for these heavy increases in wages and material the Telephone Company would be in a position to render efficient service without any adjustment of rates.
