ORDINANCE NO. 36

AN ORDINANCE LICENSING THE SALE OF CIGARETTES IN THE VILLAGE OF DOWNERS GROVE, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS AND PROVIDES A PENALTY FOR ITS VIOLATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF DOWNERS GROVE, DU PAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION ONE—LICENSE REQUIRED—It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell cigarettes within the limits of this Village without first having obtained the license as provided in Section Two of this Ordinance; provided, however, that nothing herein shall be held to authorize the sale of cigarettes containing opium, morphine, jimson weed, belladonna, glycerine and sugar.

SECTION TWO — LICENSE HOW TO OBTAIN—

The Mayor of the Village shall from time to time grant license authorizing the sale of cigarettes within the limits of said Village in the manner following and not otherwise: Any person, firm or corporation desiring a license to sell cigarettes shall file with the Village Clerk a written application, addressed to the Village Council, which application shall specify whether the application is in behalf of an individual, firm or corporation and if the license is for a single individual, firm or partnership the names of each person or partner composing said firm shall be given. Such application shall be accompanied by one or more certificates that the applicant or applicants are of good character and reputation and are suitable persons to be entrusted with the sale of cigarettes; and that in his or her opinion such licensee will fully comply with this Ordinance.

Every license granted shall be for six months or one year as the case may be. The license fee for one full year or any fractional part of a year in excess of six months shall be One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) and for six months or any fractional part of six months the license fee shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100.). No license shall be granted to extend beyond the fiscal year which year begins the first day of May of each year.

SECTION THREE—It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation licensed to sell cigarettes to sell, keep for sale or expose for sale or offer for sale, cigarettes to any person under the age of 21 years.

Any person, firm or corporation violating this section shall, in addition to the other penalties provided in this Ordinance, forfeit his license for the sale of cigarettes and the licensing fee for the unexpired term of his license shall be retained by the Village and no further license shall be granted to any such violator. A conviction for the violation of this Section shall be sufficient evidence for the Village Council to take away the license of the person or persons convicted.

SECTION FOUR—LICENSE TO BE POSTED—Any person, firm or corporation licensed under this Ordinance for the sale of cigarettes shall immediately cause to be and remain posted his or their license upon some conspicuous part of the room or place where the cigarettes are sold or exposed for sale and said license shall not be used in any other place than that in which the licensee has his principal place of business.

SECTION FIVE—PENALTY FOR NOT POSTING—Any person so licensed who shall not cause such license to be posted and keep the same posted as required in the preceding

Section shall on conviction be fined in a sum not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00.) SECTION SIX—PENALTY FOR SELLING WITHOUT A LICENSE—Any person who shall have, or keep for sale or expose for sale or offer for sale any cigarettes at any place within the Village of Downers Grove without having first procured the license as herein before provided shall be fined not less than One Hundred (\$100.00) and not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for every violation and a further penalty of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each and every violation thereafter.

SECTION SEVEN—This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and due publication. W. C. BARBER, Mayor.
