### HINSDALE AVIATOR GETS DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS

E. Harold Greist Presented Insignia of Heroism by General Leonard Wood.

E. Harold Greist of Hinsdale, who was a flight commander in the 90th Aero Squadron, was awarded a Distinguished Service Cross Thursday evening in the parlors of the Aviation Club of Chicago, the presentation being made by Maj. Gen. Wood.

This is the third decoration Lieut. Greist earned in his overseas service, and he participated in some of the fiercest fighting on the western front. He served in the same squadron with Lieut. Harvey Conover, which was one of the most effective of America's air forces.

Greist entered the service just after completing his studies at Northwestern University. He is now with the advertising department of Jos. T. Ryerson & Company.

The citation accompanying the Distinguished Service cross was as follows:

"Edward Harold Greist, first lieutenant, Air Service Aeronautics Air Service, 3rd Observation Group. For extraordinary heroism in action.

"On the morning of November 1, 1918, during the progress of an important attack, Lieut. Greist volunteered on a mission to fly through a heavy fog, in order to locate the then advanced infantry of the attack. In accomplishing this mission it was necessary to fly at a very low altitude and through the American barrage which was being fired during the flight. He penetrated several kilometers into the enemy's lines, being subjected to heavy machine gun fire from the ground which struck his plane many times, obtained information of the disposition of the enemy artillery, infantry, and our own front line. He returned through the fire with the first authentic information to reach the division commander."—Hinsdale Doings.

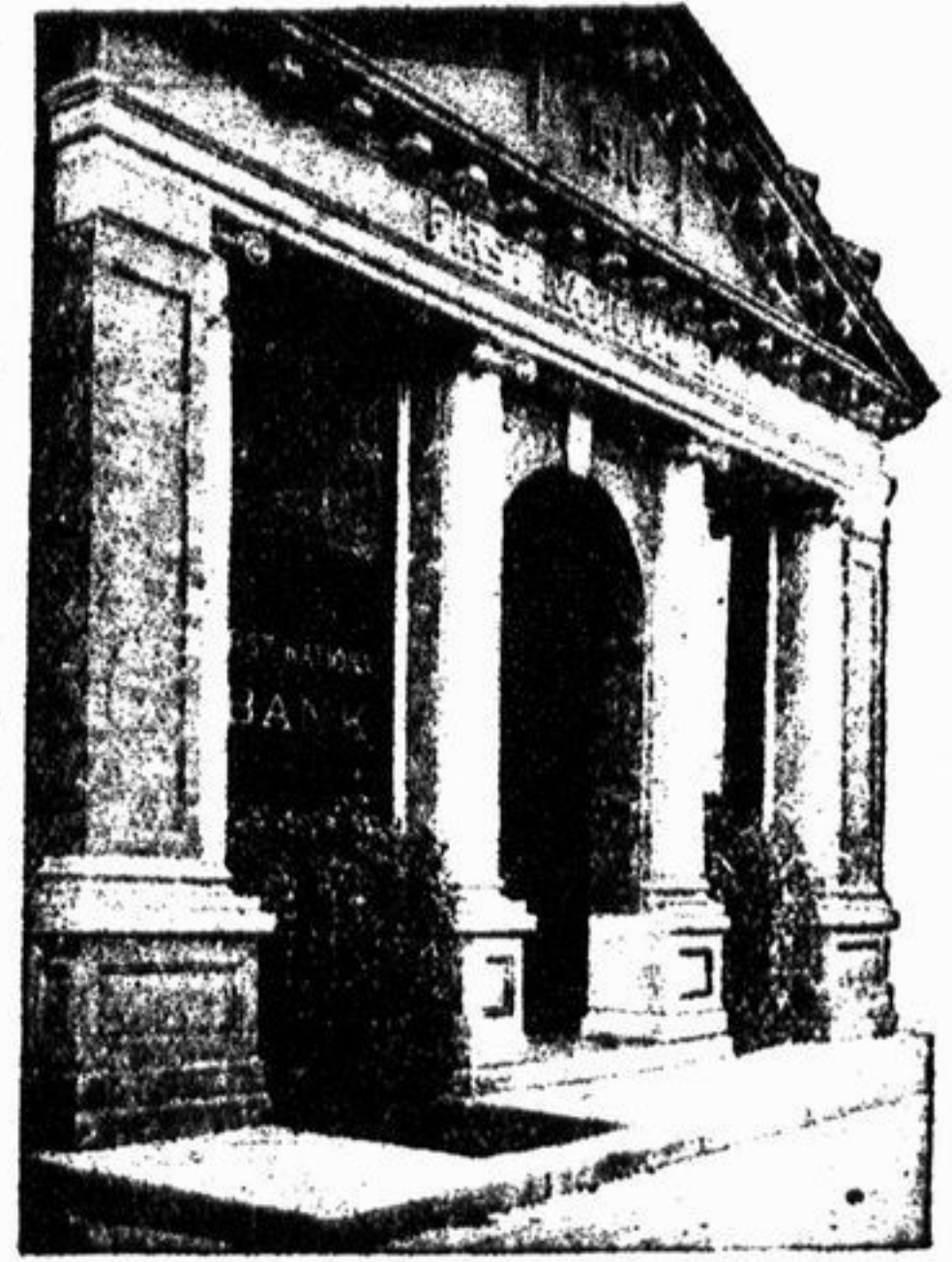

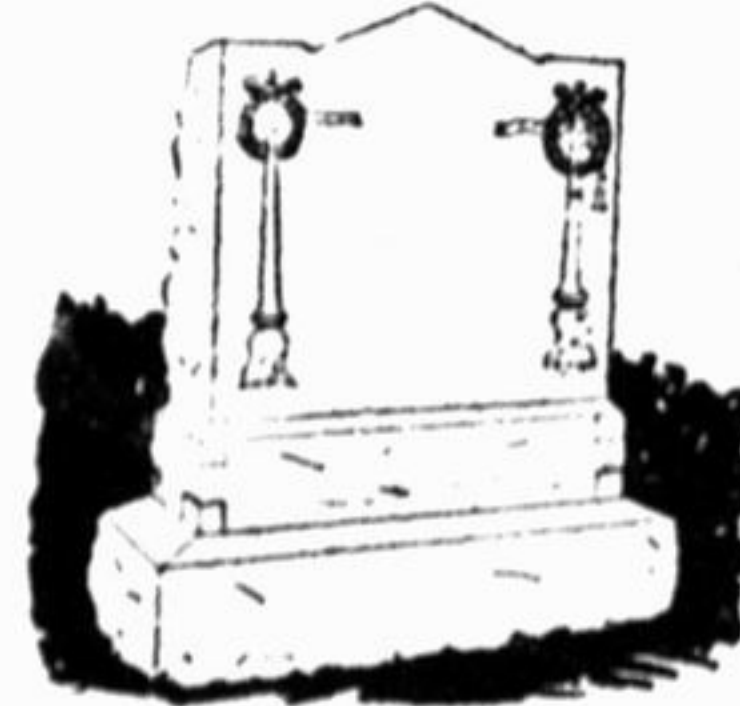
