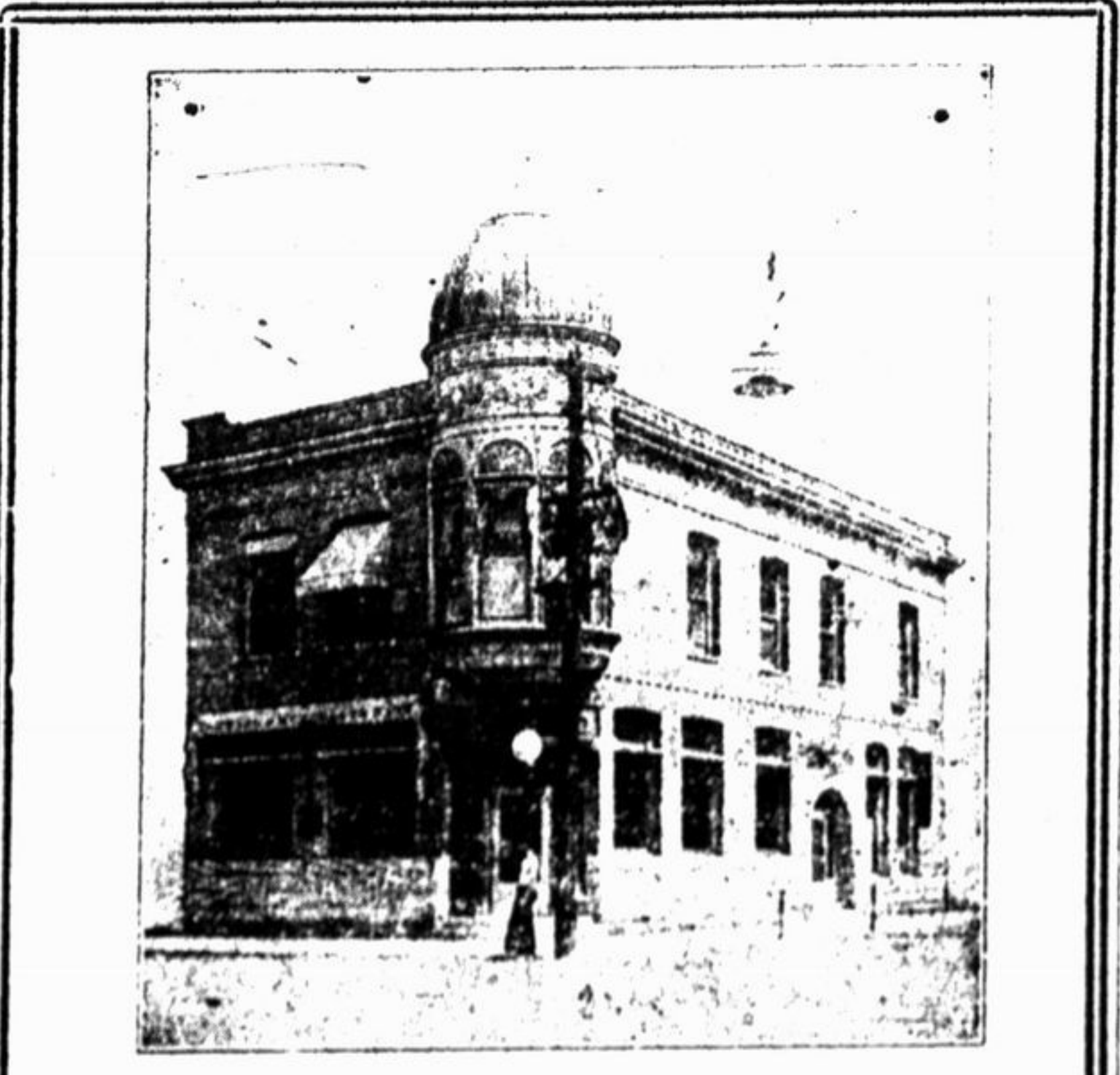
Those entitled to attend the meeting are urged to be present as plans will be discussed for the season's work.

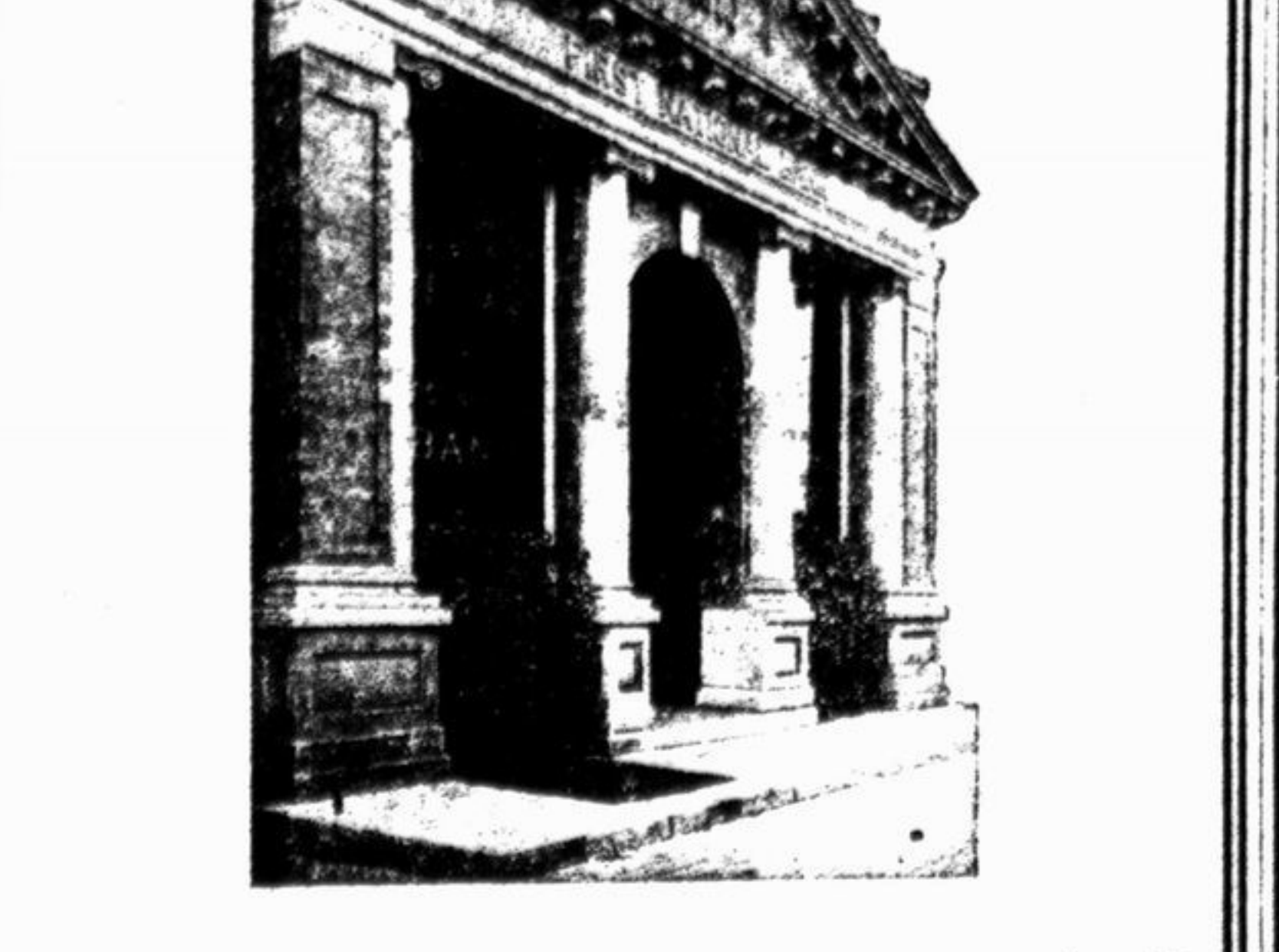
