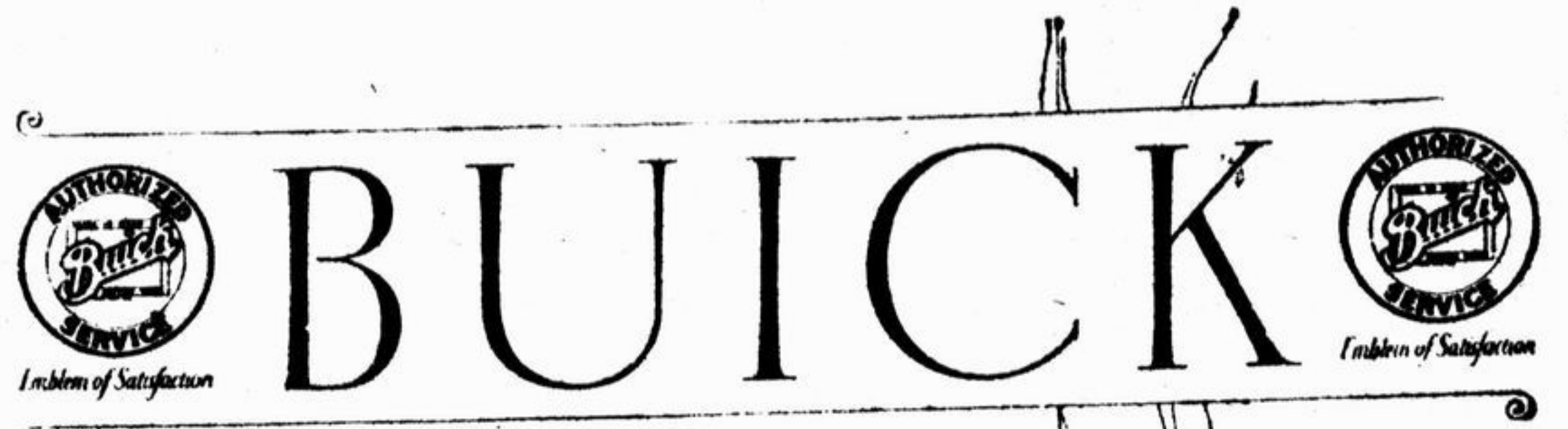

**Christmas Party.**

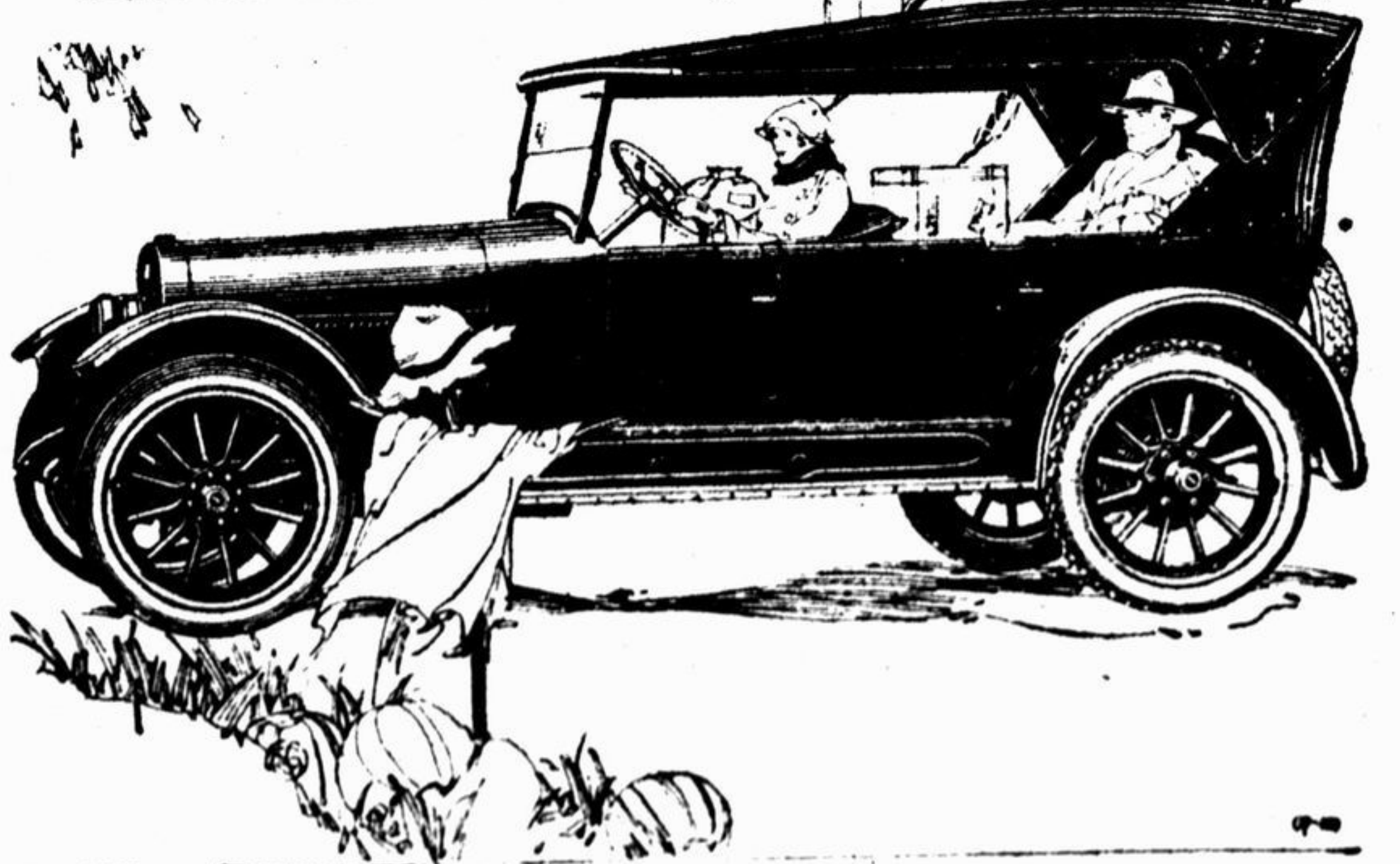
