BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF DOWNERS GROVE, ILLINOIS: SECTION 1—No theatrical shows, musical or minstrel entertainments, panoramas, performance or any feats of jugglery, slight of hand, or necromancy, moving picture shows, variety shows or circuses shall be offered or presented or carried on for gain in the Village of Downers Grove upon the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, under penalty of not less than Fifty Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars for each and every violation of this Ordinance.
