CHAS. H. WELLS VICE - PRESIDENT OF TEXAS BANK

Former Downers Grove Boy Secures Interest in Banking Business at McKinney, Texas.

Charles H. Wells, for the past three years manager of the member banks of the Federal Reserve Bank at Dallas, has moved to McKinney. Mr. Wells has purchased stock in the Collin County National Bank and been elected active vice president and also a director. The new office of vice president to which Mr. Wells has been elected has just been created. This bank now has two active vice presidents — Henry W. Warden having held this office for several years.

Mr. Wells was born at Downers Grove, Ill., in 1879. His first banking experience was with the First Calumet Trust and Savings Bank of East Chicago. He became cashier of this bank in 1914. In 1918 he went to Dallas and has since been connected with the Federal Reserve Bank.

He was in charge of the member banks in the Eleventh District composed of Texas, parts of Louisiana, parts of Oklahoma, parts of Arkansas and New Mexico. During the past three years he has traveled over the eleventh district and is well acquainted with the banking fraternity in this district and especially in Texas. Soon after he went with the Federal Reserve Bank at Dallas, Mr. Wells was appointed chief of the certificates of indebtedness division of the War Loan Department. When the universal war campaign was started, he was selected as one of the special field representatives. He was in this position for five or six months and then was field representative, his work consisting of the obtaining of new members to the Federal Reserve system in the Eleventh District. Mr. Wells is a man of pleasing address. McKinney is fortunate in securing Mr. Wells as a citizen. We welcome him and his good wife and child to the Collin county capital.—The McKinney (Texas) Examiner.

Mr. Wells is a Downers Grove boy, having been born and raised in the village. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. John Wells of Washington street, as is known to many local people.

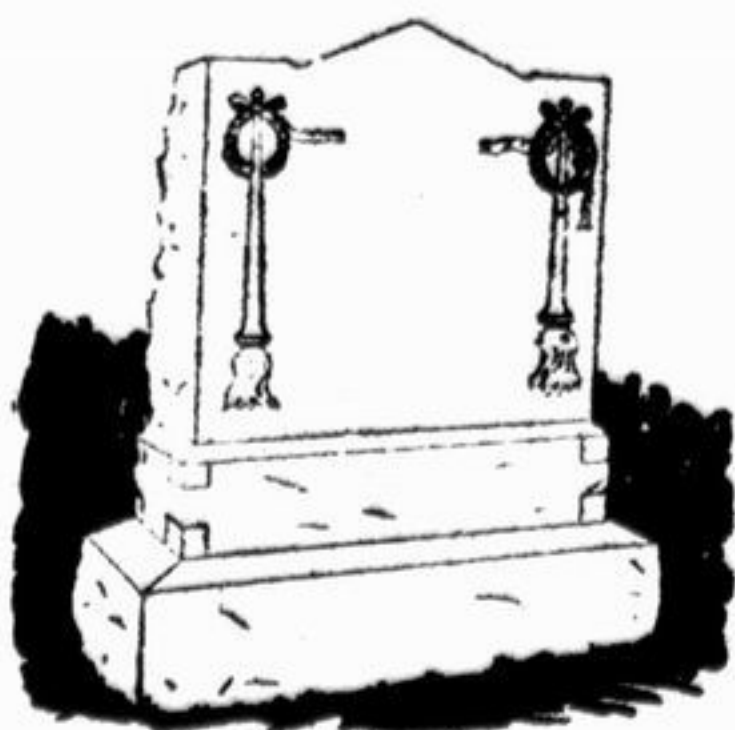
