Six Petitions Filed For Commissionerships—Five Will Go On The Ballot.

Wednesday was the last day for the filing of petitions for village offices and as it has been in the past it now is; just about enough candidates for the offices to be filed and that's all.

Walter C. Barber is the only one in the majority race, five names will go on the ballots for commissioners, Delbert Austin, William Bender, Harry Bryce, Chas. Fisher and E. G. Hearty. E. L. Dickerson filed a petition but he was not here to make out an affidavit of candidacy so his petition could not be used and his name will not go on the ballot.

Two Running For Magistrate There are two candidates for the office of Police Magistrate, Jos. V. Dieter and Carl A. Carlson having filed petitions.

Petitions in for members of the Library Board are, W. B. Towseley, Stanley J. Brown, Walter R. Curtis, L. B. Wells, F. C. Lancaster and Edna M. Perron.

Unless some one runs by petition in the meanwhile, the election will be another tame affair.

Completed, the work already done, and officially reports the services performed by the American Committee as 100 per cent effective and efficient. The American Red Cross had itself contributed \$2,200,000 up to August, 1918 and has been adding \$200,000 a month since that date. An amount equal to \$100,000 a month has been contributed by the Rockefeller Foundation.

Congress has under consideration an appropriation of \$100,000,000 for relief work in the Old World, but in the act of appropriation made the money available only as loans to organized governments that could undertake repayment. Armenia and Syria are examples of localities, not of governments and are without responsible authority by which such loans can be secured. All aid given these people must be given them as individuals in America.

ily of our deceased neighbor, a copy be published in the Downers Grove Reporter and a copy be spread on our records.

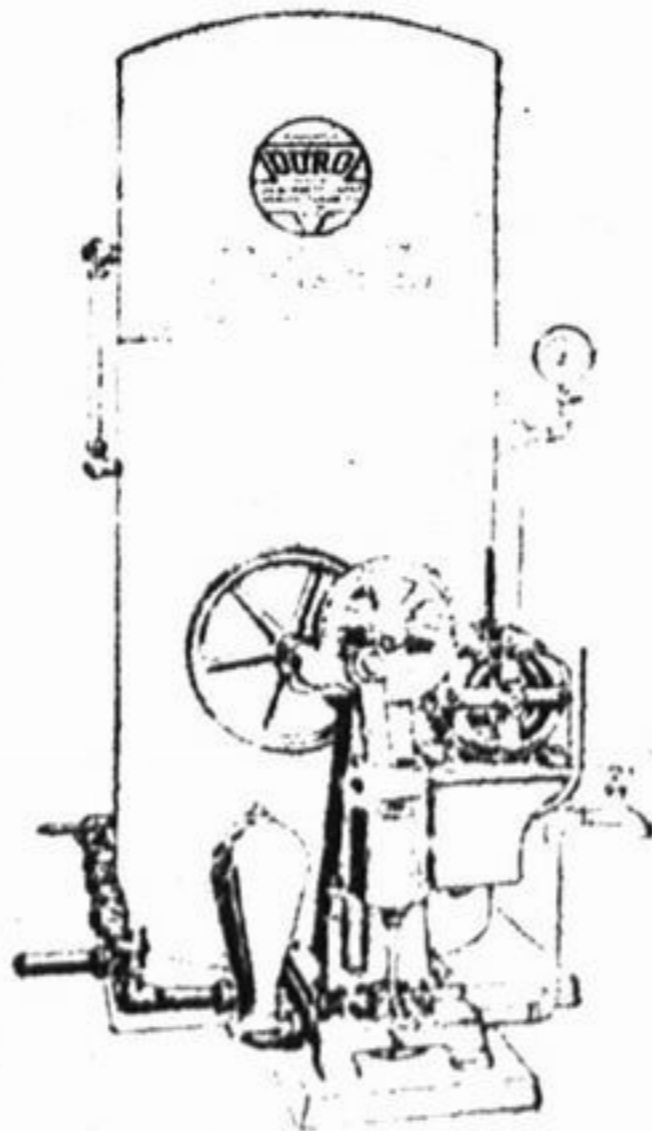

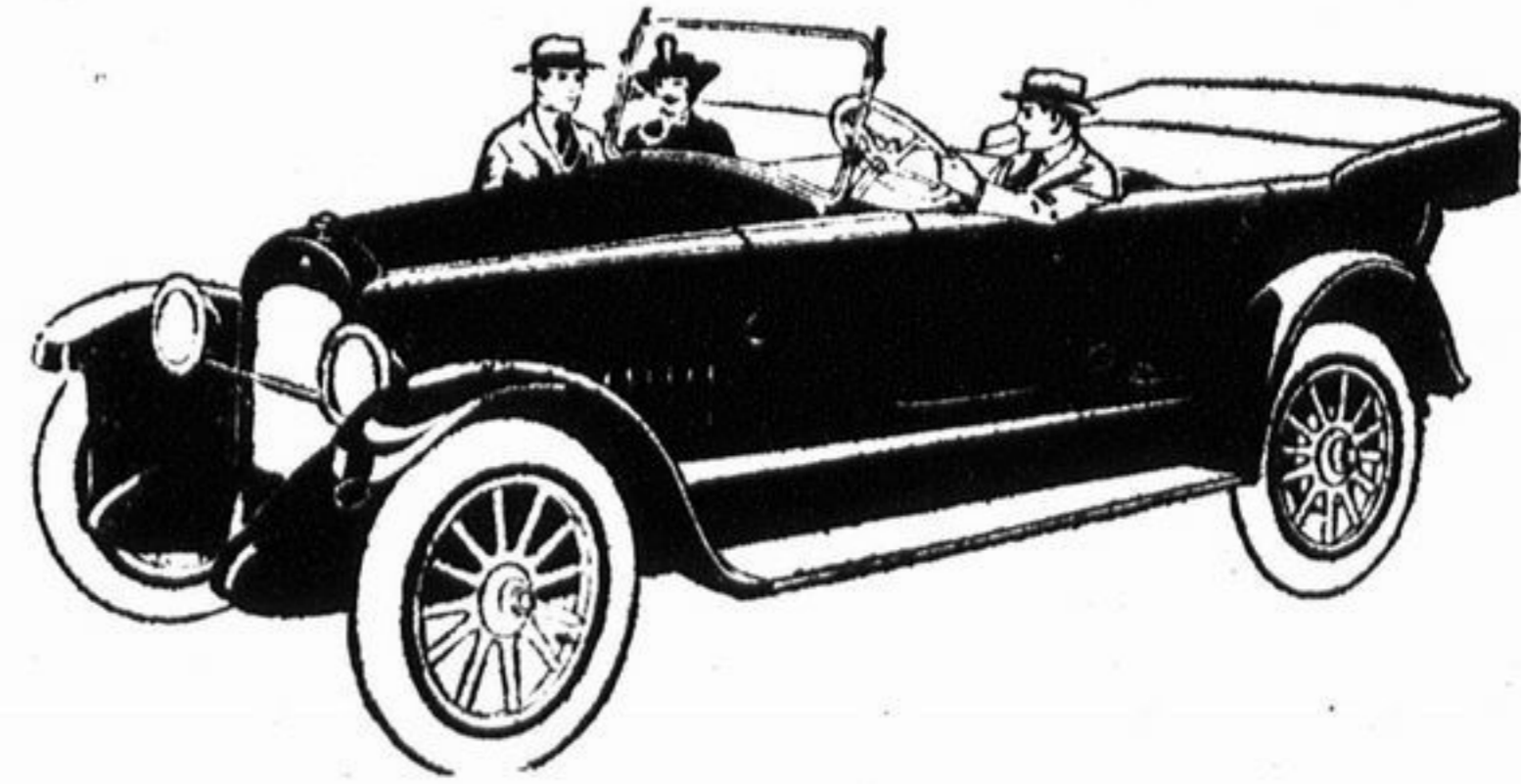
