

### UNKNOWN MAN HANGS SELF NEAR CLARENDON HILLS

Inquest Discloses That All Means of Identification Had Been Thrown Away

The body of an unknown man, apparently about 65 years of age, was found hanging to a tree near the Clarendon Hills depot this morning. Nothing was found on or about the body whereby it could be identified and it is being held at C. F. Davis' Undertaking rooms, awaiting claimants or final disposition.

Coroner Hopf, of Wheaton, was notified and the inquest held at eleven-thirty this morning, the following facts being brought out.

Arthur C. Chester, of East Grove, boarded the 6:57 train this morning to go to his work in Chicago. When nearly to Clarendon Hills he happened to glance out of the window and saw the body hanging to a tree. He got off at the next station and went back to investigate finding that the man had put his belt around his neck tied the other end to the limb of a tree and raised his legs up until the strap could choke him to death.

Chester immediately got in touch with Chief Venard who notified Mr. Davis, the undertaker and with him went to Clarendon Hills, cut the body down and brought it to the Grove.

The man wore a rich, heavy fur coat over an almost new mackinaw, clean under and outer clothing, tan shoes and had fourteen cents tied up in one corner of his handkerchief. The only thing which could serve to identify him, was a slip of paper, found in his vest pocket with the address "1625 W. 20th Street," written on it in pencil.

This information has been given the Chicago police and as we go to press nothing has been heard from them.

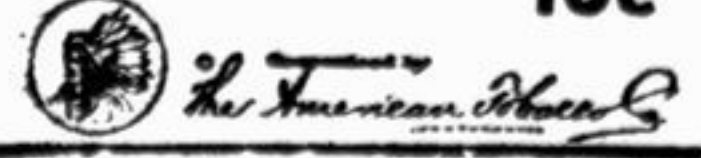

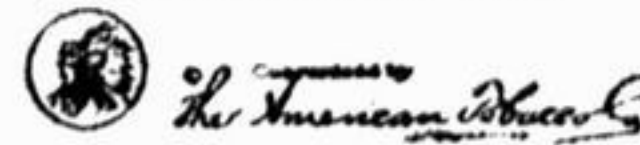
